//// LABRADOR CITY LIBRARY-CLOSED NOVEMBER 11 ////

The Library in Labrador City will be CLOSED ALL DAY on MONDAY, NOVEMBER
11th, 1968 - REMEMBRANCE DAY.

The attention of library book borrowers is called to the fact that there are
more than two hundred (200) books overdue in the 'Books on Loan' file at
the library. You must agree that this is far too great a number. The
number of people who are reading books from the library is increasing very
rapidly (during September and October, circulation was 3,248 adult and
juvenile books) and it is felt that this will continue as winter settles
in and the days grow colder, and nights longer. People may be waiting to
read, or anxiously looking for, the very book which you have been unable to
return to the library.

During 'YOUNG CANADA BOOK WEEK', from November 15th to November 22nd,
there will be no charge on overdue books returned to the library. After
December 1st, however, the fines charged on OVERDUE BOOKS will be increased,
and adults will be charged a maximum of \$1.00 per book per month. Children
will be charged a maximum of 50¢ per book per month. The rise in fines
is to cover the extra expenditure required on overdue notices and books
which are lost to the library through non-return.

FIRST CONCERT OF SEASON - GREAT SUCCESS !

The first concert of the 1968/69 season of the Labrador City / Wabush Community Concert Association was held in the Auditorium of the Labrador City Collegiate on Tuesday November 5.

A near capacity audience heard the eminent french pianist, JEAN CASADESUS present a scintillating programme of Bach, Mozart, Beethoven, Chopin and Debussy.

The highlight of the evening in the writer's opinion was the Beethoven Sonata No. 23 in F minor, Op.57 known as the "Appassionata" which was superbly presented. The Debussy preludes were interpreted with the insight that is inborn of frenchmen. The writer was fascinated at the way the pianist's talents together with the music so accurately simulated the dancing flames of fire in the 'Feux d'artifice'.

We are indeed fortunate in being able to bring to our town such superb artistry.

AUDIO-VISUAL WORKSHOP

On Friday November 1st the Labrador West Branch of the Newfoundland Teachers' Association held a one-day workshop in audio-visual education. The consultant for the day was professor Garfield Fizzard, director of the Audio-Visual centre at Memorial University.

In his opening remarks, professor Fizzard stressed the need for better communication and emphasized the importance of the audio-visual technique in achieving better communication between teacher and pupil.

Throughout the remainder of the day the teachers were shown various techniques in using the overhead projector, tape recorder, slide and film strip projector as well as the movie projector. The advantages and disadvantages, capabilities and liabilities of each type of equipment were also stressed.

In the afternoon the 130 teachers present broke up into small groups to discuss the many points raised by professor Fizzard and to bring forward any suggestions regarding audio-visual services in this area.

The teachers were quite pleased with the workshop and most groups recommended a follow-up programme designed to instruct teachers in the technicalities of audio-visual equipment.

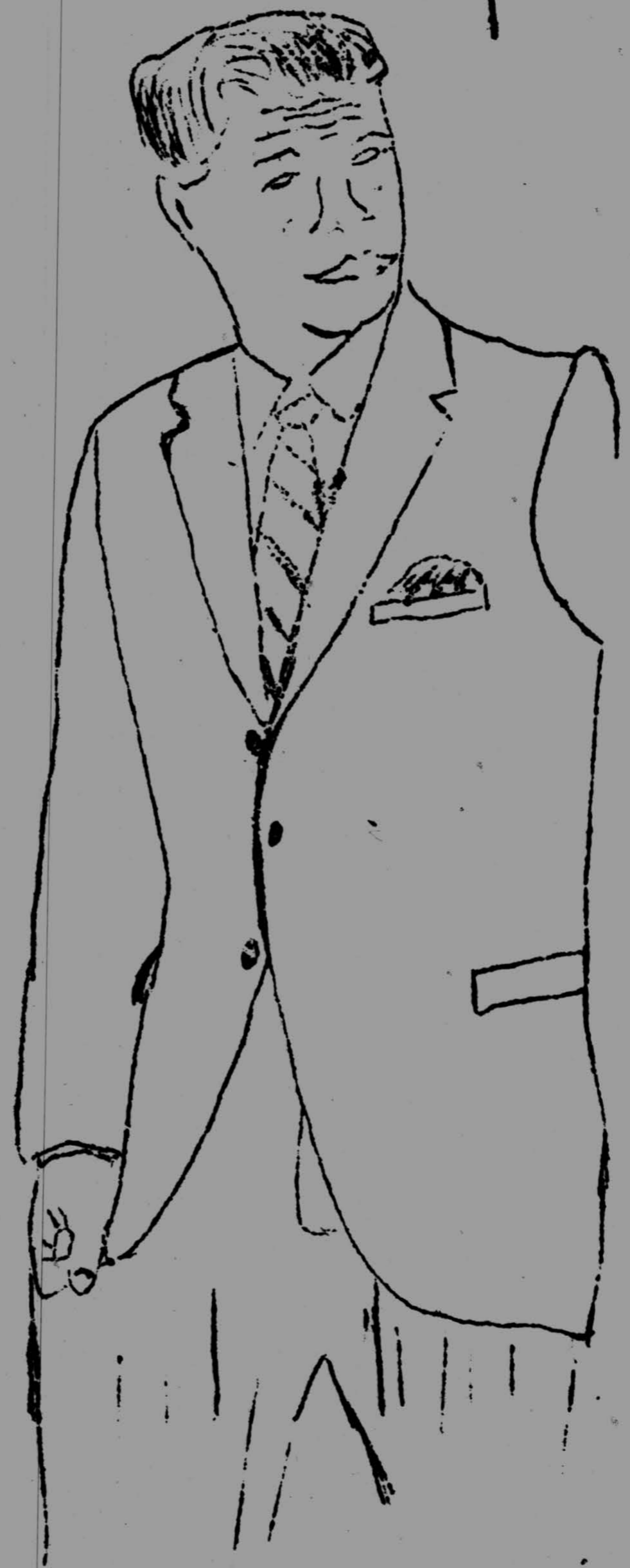

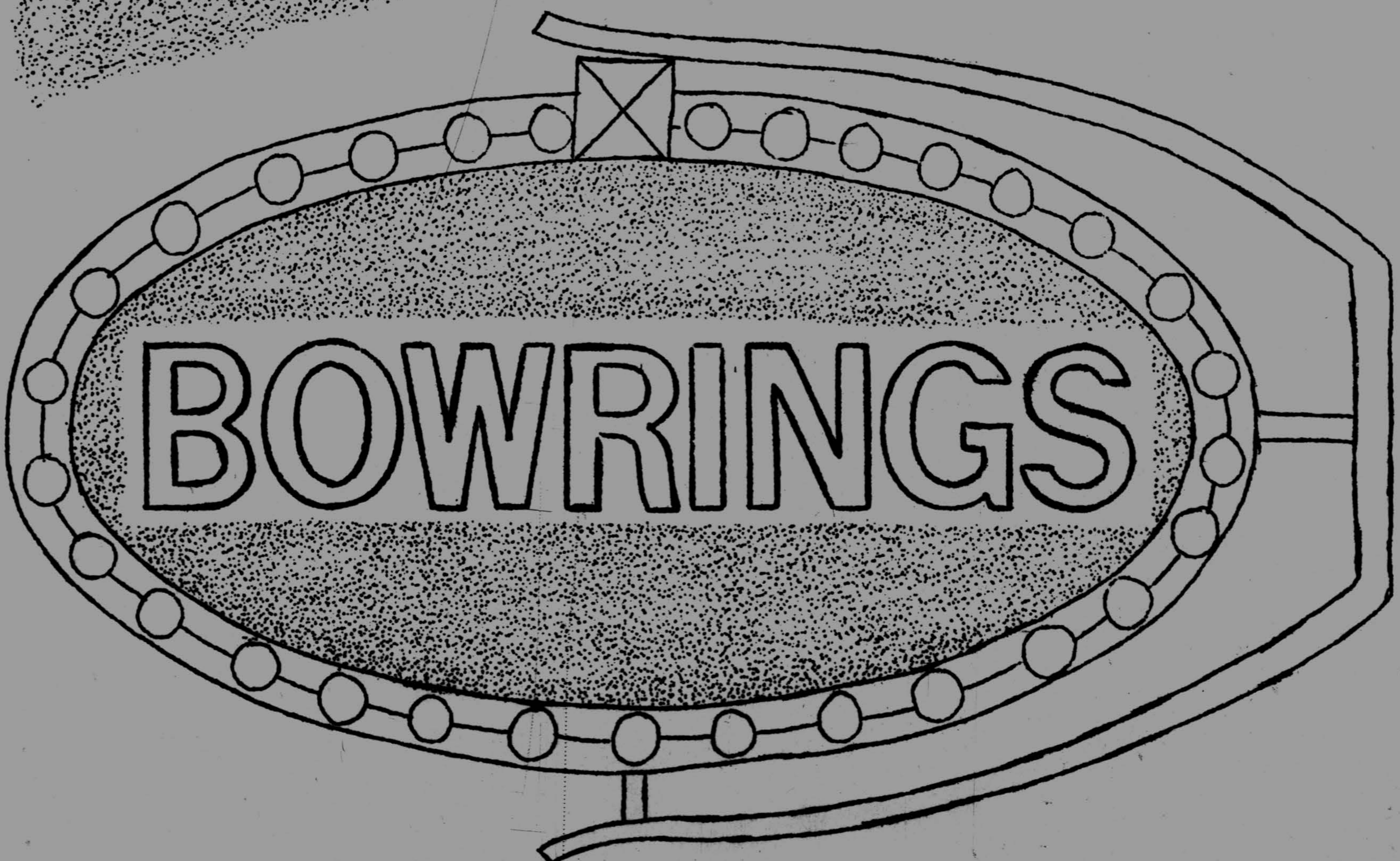
