Although TB is no longer a chief killer, it is still a public health menace to every community. Last year 241 new, active cases were discovered. This rate of about 48 per 100,000 of population is, by far, the highest in Canada.

For this reason we are stepping up our TB Case Finding programme and, at the same time, attempting to broaden our Health Education to include full information on other Respiratory Diseases, particularly Emphysema which was responsible for more deaths in Canada last year that were caused by TB.

This once-a-year Campaign needs the solid backing of all the citizens in our Province. Your use of Christmas Seals will demonstrate that you support this worthy cause.

Les artistes réprésents sont connus professionnellement sous le nom de Addiss et Crofut Explorateurs de la Chanson (Chansonniers Internationaux).

COMMUNITY CONCERTS

The Community Concerts Association of Labrador will present it's second concert of the 1968-69 season on November 22 (Friday) at 8:30 pm in the Labrador City Collegiate Auditorium. The artists are known professionally as Addiss and Crofut - Explorers in Song (International Balladeers).

Steve Addiss and Bill Crofut are two gifted young men who accompany their singing of folksongs from all parts of the world on a variety of musical instruments. They have a repertoire of songs in thirty-two different languages, and are proficient with at least six different musical instruments which they use to accompany their own singing.

The duo became friends during their schooldays, and after Addiss graduated from Harvard as a music teacher and composer, and Crofut majored in music at Allegheny College, they were drawn together again and formed their present partnership when Crofut was awarded a grant from the U.S. State Department, to tour South-East Asia. They have appeared at various times on U.S. Television Programmes and are a very popular pair.

/// BREATH OF SCOTLAND COMES TO LABRADOR ///

Monday evening November 11th was indeed a memorable one for the residents of Labrador City and Wabush, when once again they clapped their hands, stamped their feet and thrilled to the swing of the kilt during the Andy Stewart White Heather Show.

Andy is Scotland's most popular entertainer, with his singing, his impersonations of international stars and of course his side-splitting humour. His first visit to Labrador in February last was such a great success that Mr Sandy Cruickshank arranged this return visit.

Once more Andy won the hearts of his audience, especially with his latest song "The Green Crystal Bag" a humorous ditty on Britain's Police method of determining the amount of alcohol consumed by motorists.

With Andy on this visit was his lovely and charming wife, Sheila, they have five children and Andy tells us that his young son will most likely follow in his 'faithers' footsteps, he already sings well and is quite a wee comic. One other member of the family is Alfie, the Stewart's St. Bernard dog.

The show was compered by Mr John Mulvaney, a very funny wee Glaswegian - off stage as well as on. His ability to ad-lib was terrific, he had the audience in fits of laughter completely winning them over in the first few minutes. John is very well known to all in Scotland.

A truly great performance of Highland Dancing was given by Miss Nancy Lee Hays who holds the World Champion title for her dancing. Miss Hays is a very pretty young lady, and believe it or not, she is NOT a Scot, although she does boast Scottish ancestry. Nancy hails from Edmonton, Alberta and she has visited Scotland on two occasions to compete in the Highland Games. She will be returning with the White Heather Show at the end of their Canadian tour where she will reside at the home of Miss Jennifer Shaw of Aberdeen.

Jennifer is also a member of the show and is Scotland's answer to Julie Andrews. She is a very sweet wee lassie and extremely pretty, with a voice as clear and pure as a Highland stream. Jennifer's introduction to the stage began when at the age of twelve she won a talent competition whilst on her vacation. From there Jennifer has climbed steadily up the ladder of success. She was very much impressed with Canada and only regrets not having the time to learn to skate.

Arthur Spinks isn't too anxious to learn how to skate however, for as an accordianist he has to take special care of his very precious fingers. The way in which his fingers fly over the keys is truly amazing. Monday was Remembrance Day and everyone was deeply moved by Arthur's beautiful rendering of "The Last Post", in remembrance of all those who died in battle. This young man hails from Dundee and is married with a 10 month old child. The younger members of the audience were obviously "sent" by the mischeivious twinkle in his eye.

What words can I use to describe adequately the magnificent voice of Bill McCue. As I likened Jennifer's voice to a highland stream, Bill's voice has in it, the depth of Scotlands lochs, the rich purple of the heather and the warmth and friendliness of her people.

Bill studied in Glasgow, London and finally in Milan, Italy. In 1961 he won the Kathleen Ferrier Scholarship - an extremely coveted award. His home is in Bothwell, but he came originally from Shatts - a little mining town in Lanarkshire, my own home town. In my opinion, Scotland has in Bill McCue, one of her finest singers ever. A fine performance by Bill McCue, an artist who does justice to the kilt.

The accompanist was Alan Cameron an excellent pianist. I did hear a rumour that Alan is an Englishman - with a name like that - unbelievable !

The responsibility of this tour lay on the shoulders of Mr. J. Warren, the tour manager, who for almost three months has taken the White Heather Show to many parts of Canada, our many thanks to him, and to all the members of the White Heather Show may we say a sincere THANK YOU !

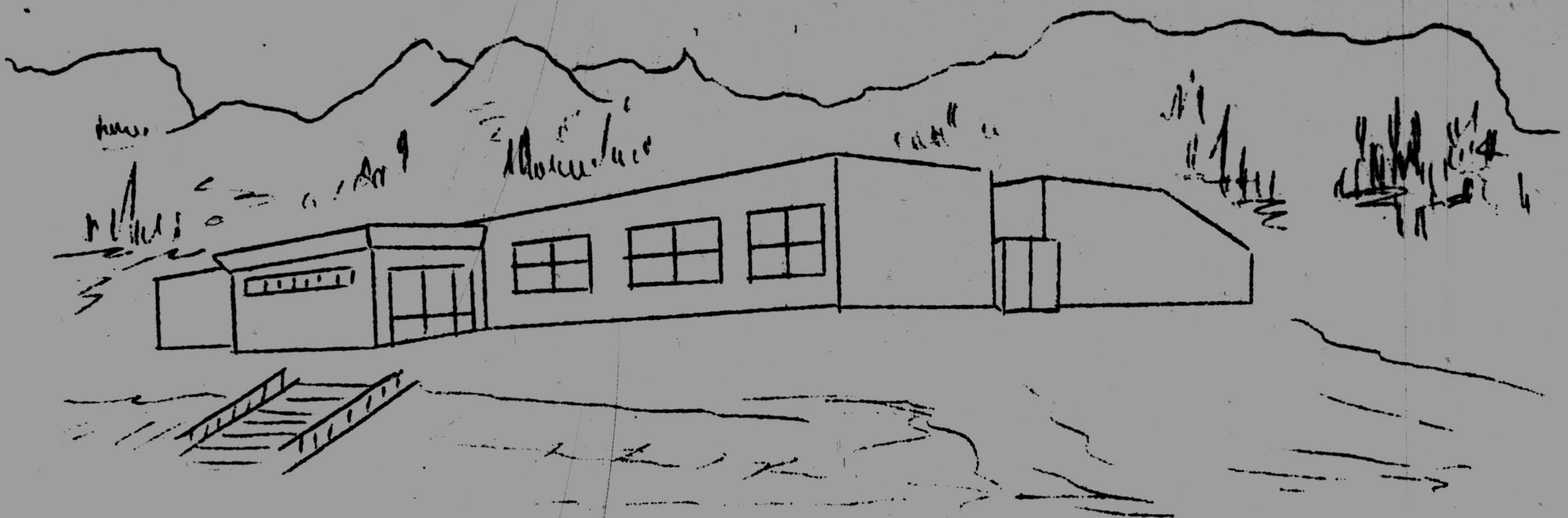
