HOUSE-TRAINING YOUR DOG

PETS CORNER

I lay no claim to being an expert on dog-training. But having read many good books on the subject and putting the information learned into practice, I should like to pass on a few hints which may benefit many new dog owners.

A pup, like a child requires training right from the start. His behaviour and good manners are a reflection on his owner! It's not a difficult thing to train your dog, it just takes patience, understanding and kindness. One must be firm without being cruel; beating a dog into submission is futile and only proves a person's inadequacy as a human being. A well trained dog can bring years of happiness and companionship to it's proud master!

Begin training your puppy by showing him just exactly where he is allowed to go to relieve himself (a particular place should be covered with newspapers) When he uses the carpet or some other forbidden spot, soak it up with part of the paper from "his corner" - replacing it when finished. Take him to the "forbidden spot" and say "bad boy!" or "shame!" at the same time smack a rolled up newspaper on your hand or leg . . . NEVER, NEVER smack the dog - it is not necessary! Now take him to his own paper, he'll get the message - perhaps not immediately, but be patient and firm with him. The first time he does use his own spot make a big fuss over him; say "good boy!" "clever boy!" hug him, pat him and perhaps even reward him with a little tit-bit - he'll practically turn himself inside out because he knows he has pleased you! From then on you will have no problems. The forbidden spot should be washed with a solution of vinegar and water, it will not stain and will eliminate any odour.

Next week I will pass on a few more hints that I have found very helpful in training my own dog. If you have any problems regarding your own dog and think I could assist, I will be very happy to help in any way that I can.

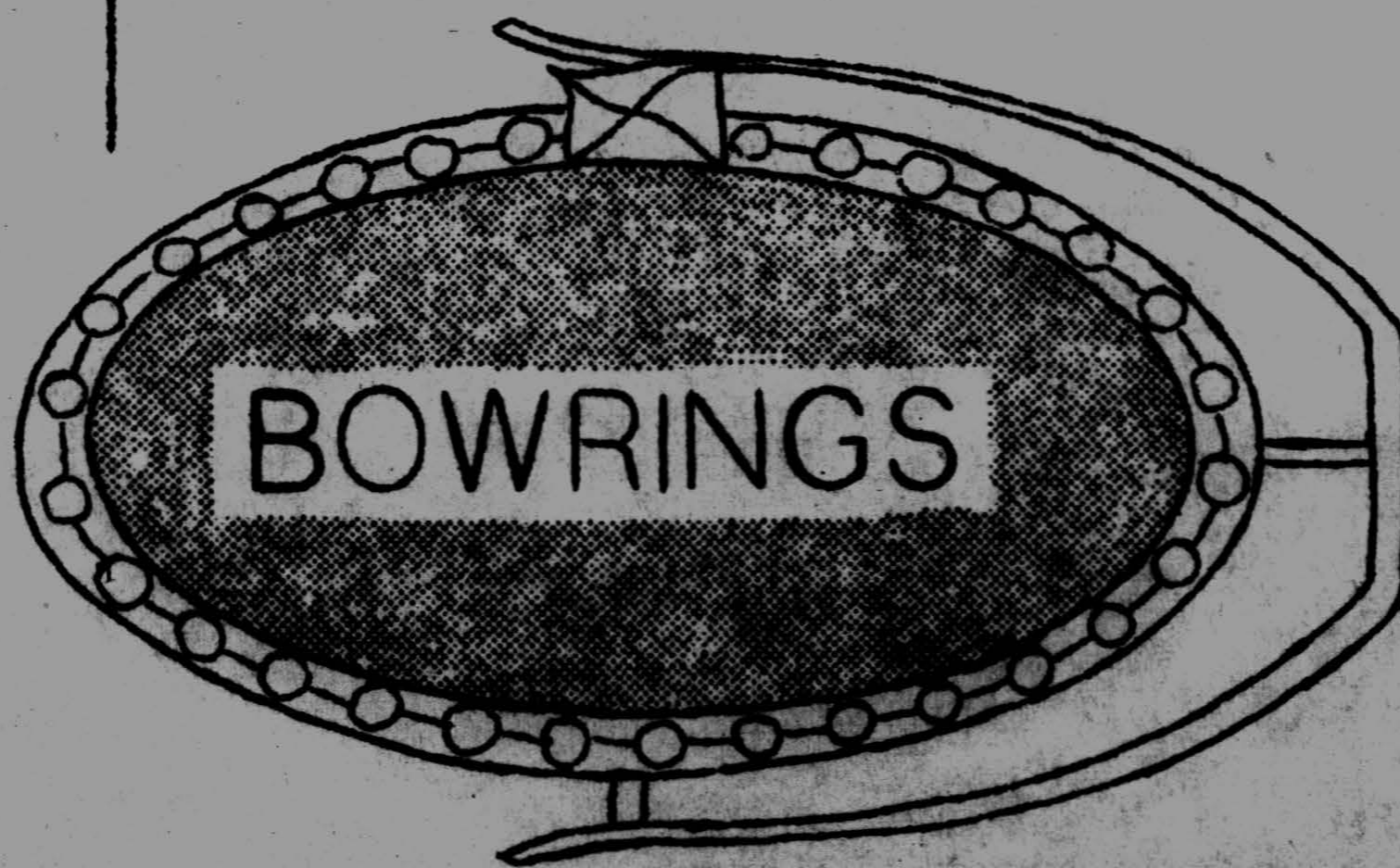
