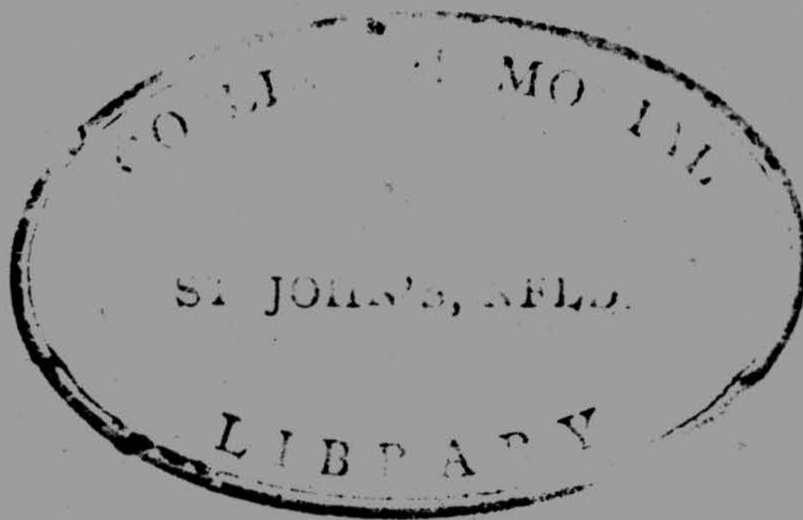

DEDICATION OF NEW CHURCH BUILDING

Sunday, December 15, marks the opening of the new church building in Labrador City to be jointly shared by the two congregations of St. Paul's Anglican Church and Carol United Church. Present for dedication will be the Rt. Rev. R.L. Seaborn, Anglican Bishop of Newfoundland, and Dr. A.E. Kewley, President of the Newfoundland Conference of the United Church. They will be assisted in the service of dedication by his Judge L.B. Soper of Cornerbrook, chairman of Humber Presbytery, the Rev. Donald Harvey, rural dean of Labrador, and the ministers of the two congregations, the Rev. William Bellamy and the Rev. Eric Snider. Special guests for the occasion will be the Rev. Leonard Whitten, who was for six years priest-in-charge of the Anglican Church in Labrador City and the Rev. A.S. Butt, Home Mission Superintendent for the United Church in Newfoundland. Members of the clergy from other local congregations will also participate in the opening services.

Both congregations have roots in the area going back over ten years. The first United Church service was held in the kitchen of an exploration camp at Dooley Lake in 1956 and Anglican services began in the old campsite in July 1958. The spirit of friendly co-operation between the two congregations throughout the intervening years was brought to a head a year ago when a decision was reached to share together in the building of a church which might be used by both groups. The first sod was turned in May of this year, and construction was begun by the firm of Desrosiers et Freres of Sept-Iles in July. The work has been supervised by a joint building committee consisting of Messrs. J. Dunkin, A. Rendell, D. Jessinghouse, R. Jessop, J. Detton, and R.J. Attersley. After the new building is opened the two congregations will continue to have separate Sunday morning services, but will join together in worship on Sunday evenings.

The service of dedication at 11:00 am on Sunday morning will be marked by the signing of an agreement between the two congregations and denominations concerning the new church. On Sunday evening at 8:00 pm. a combined choir from the two churches will present a Christmas Cantata, God in a Star, under the direction of Miss D. Coole. A social hour and reception will follow the evening service. Members and friends of the two congregations are cordially invited to be present.

TAKE PROPER CARE OF YOUR WATCHDOG!

Every animal owner knows that proper housing and care is well worth while, not only for the animals themselves but also in his own financial interests. However, there is one domestic animal for which there is usually no care or even pity: the watchdog. Day and night the poor creature is the prisoner of a chain which is usually too short. In summer when the sun beats down on his kennel, he desperately tries to find some shade. Droppings accumulate around his kennel since they are not removed and the dog cannot go anywhere else because of the chain. There is nobody to

deliver him from vermin which is often a plague. Even if this is done occasionally - it is so easy nowadays - nobody thinks of the vermin-infested kennel which should be cleaned out and disinfected with boiling water. The watchdog is often given cold food in a dish that is rarely cleaned. It is often forgotten that his drinking-water needs changing: "He hasn't emptied his bowl yet". The worst time, however, for the watchdog is winter. Damp and cold penetrate through cracks in the walls of his kennel. Only too often there is no proper dry straw bedding and even more often no sacking at the entrance of the kennel to keep out draughts. Sometimes the unfortunate animal pleads for a few hours freedom from the chain, but all in vain. (World Federation for the Protection of Animals)

ACTION FOR ANIMALS

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP
CAULIFLOWER, CURRIED

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cauliflower
- 1 onion
- 1 apple
- 2 oz margarine
- Half teacup of milk
- 2 teaspoonfuls of lemon juice
- 1/4 pint of brown gravy.
- 1 tablespoonful of vinegar
- 1 tablespoonful of curry powder
- 1 teaspoonful of milk
- 1/2 teaspoonful of sugar
- A little salt.

METHOD. Boil the cauliflower carefully, not to break it. Cut up the onion and fry in the melted margarine. Chop the apple very fine. Make a paste of the curry powder and milk; add the lemon juice, vinegar, sugar and salt. Pour the mixture into a stew-pan; add the onion and apple, then the gravy. Bring to the boil, and simmer until thick enough. Dish the cauliflower (reject the green leaves) and pour the curry over. Serve quickly.

INDUCTION SERVICE TO TAKE PLACE
SUNDAY NEXT

In St. Peter's Church, Wabush, this coming Sunday evening at 6:30, the Lord Bishop of Newfoundland, the Right Reverend Robert L. Seaborn, will officiate at a special Service of Induction. At this Service the Reverend William J. Bellamy will formally be installed as Priest in Charge of the Mission of Labrador West. Mr. Bellamy is a graduate of the Memorial University of Newfoundland, and of Queen's College, in St. John's. Prior to his appointment to the Mission of Labrador West, he served as Curate in the Parish of Channel for four years. He succeeds the Reverend Leonard Whitten, who is now Rector of the Parish of Gander Bay. It is hoped that Mr. Whitten will be present for this Service of Induction, along with the Reverend Donald Harvey, Rural Dean of Labrador.

All members of the Anglican congregations of Labrador City and Wabush, along with any interested friends of the Mission are cordially invited to attend this service.

DISCUSSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS

On Monday, December 9, a special assembly was held at the Labrador City Collegiate. The theme of this assembly was Human Rights, and the guest speaker for this occasion was Mr. George McCurdy, Human Rights Administrator of the Fair Employment Practices Branch, Department of Labour, Ottawa: Mr. McCurdy was introduced to the gathering by Miss Lillian Bouzanne, Director of Labrador Affairs.

The assembly began with a panel discussion which was organized by Mr. J.J. Murphy, History teacher at the Collegiate. Four high school students, representing both the English and French sections of the School, participated in this panel. The speakers, Nancy Reilly, John Murphy, Michael McCullough and H el ene Carr e chose as their topics, discrimination, prejudice, aspects of discrimination and French - English relations, respectively.

After the Panel Discussion, Mr. McCurdy gave an enlightening talk about Human Rights, the emphasis of his talk being on discrimination, particularly in industry.

Following Mr. McCurdy's talk there was a question period during which many of the students addressed questions to the guest speaker. The Assembly closed at 12:00pm.
