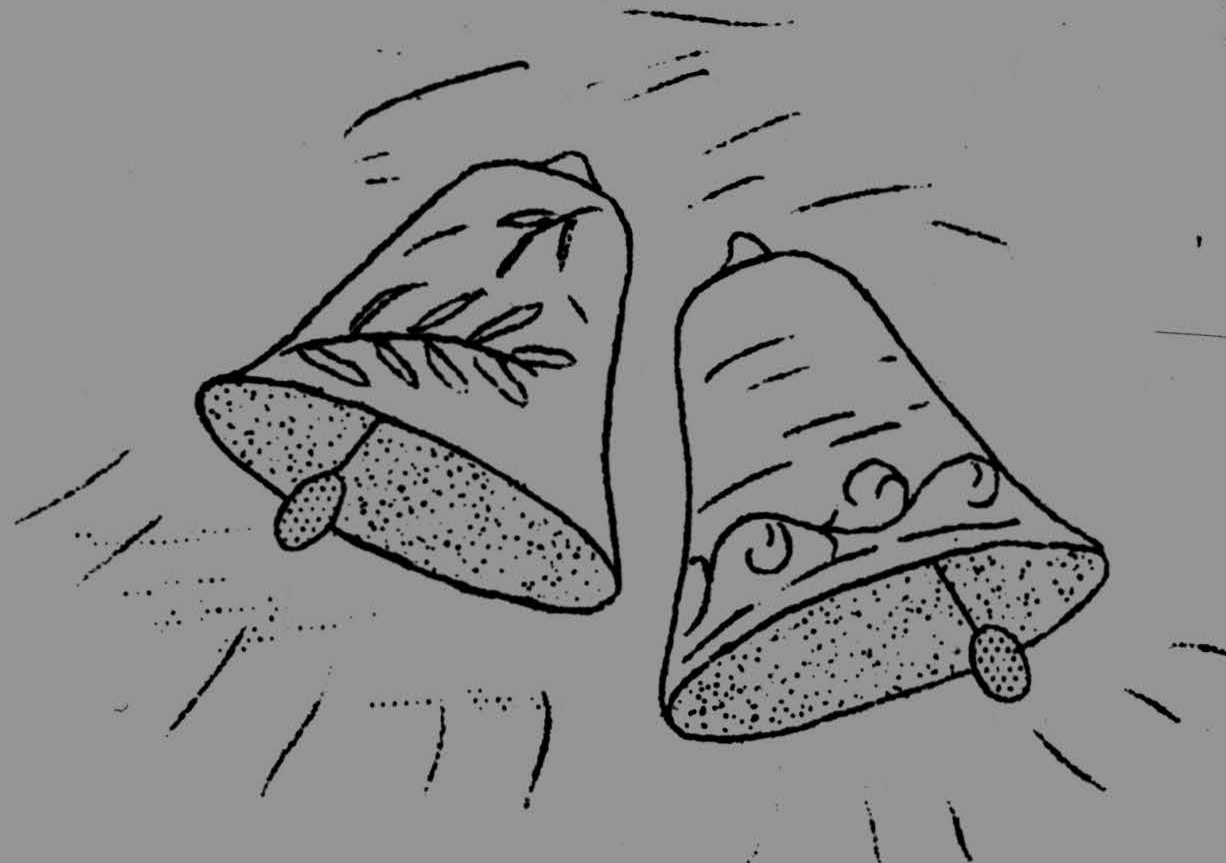

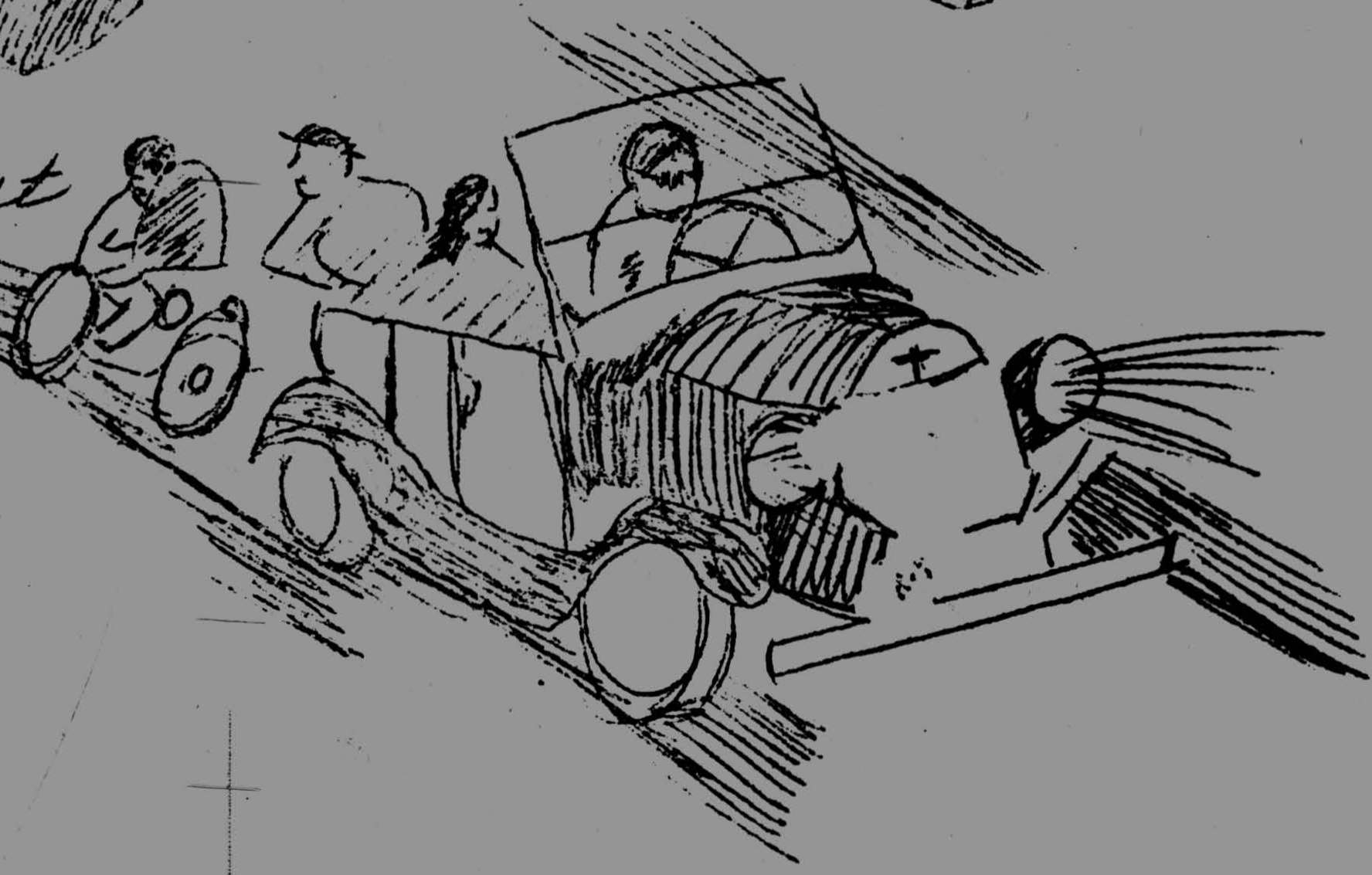

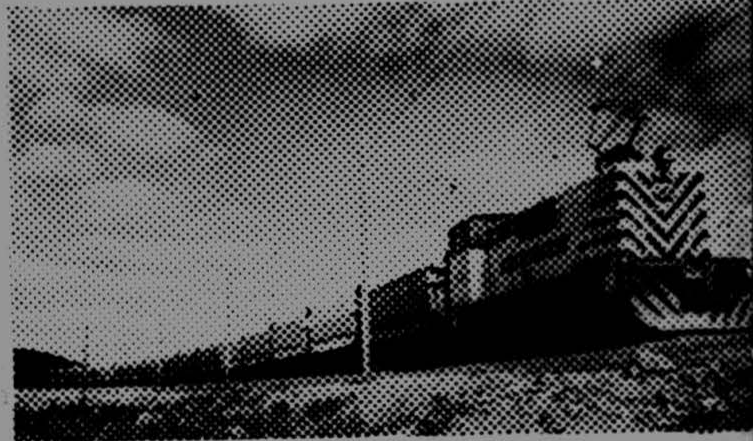
Labrador City

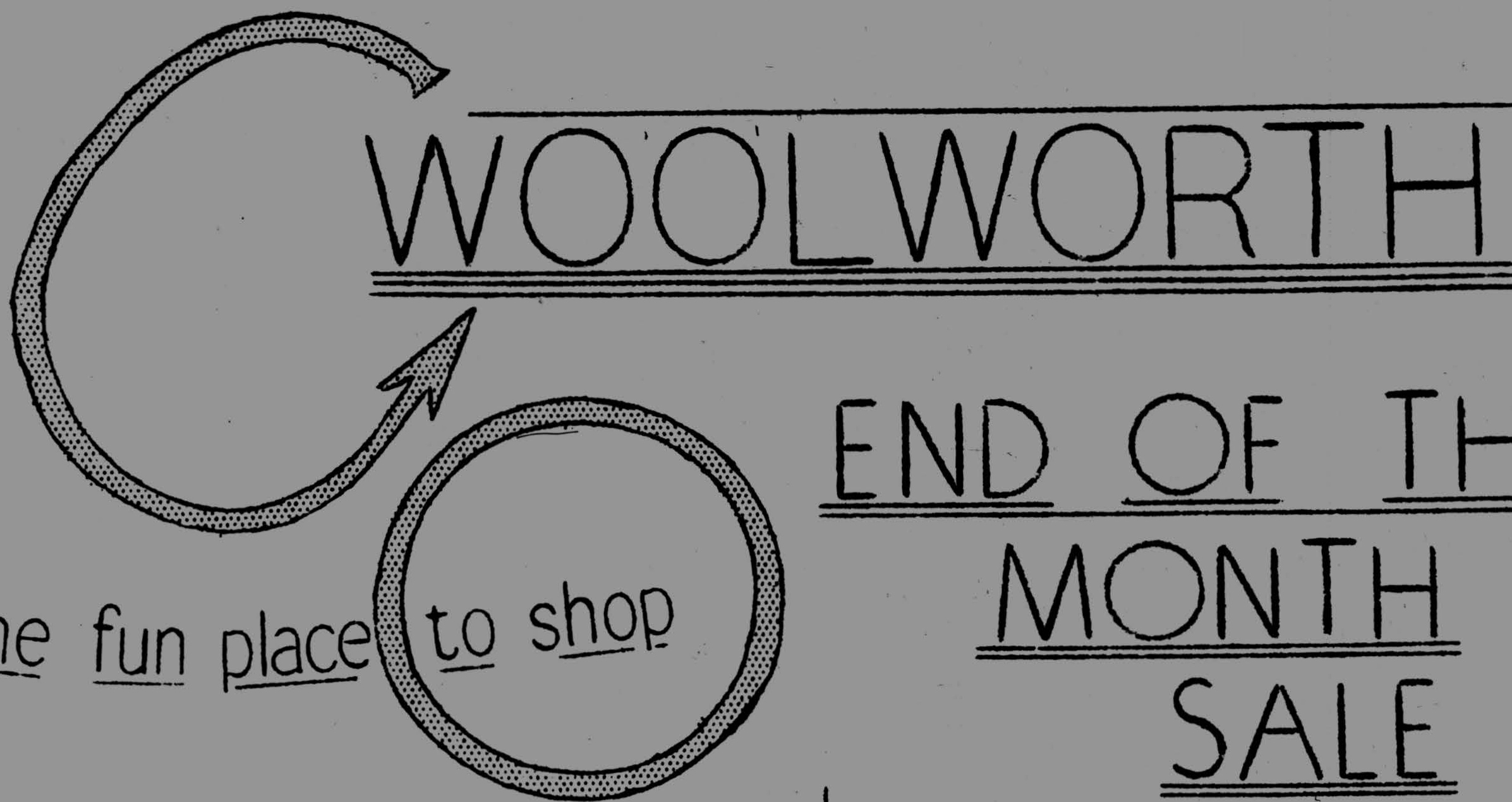

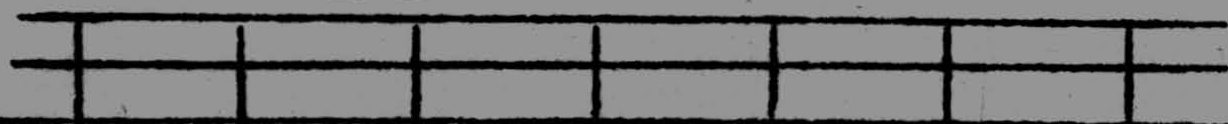

MANPOWER REVIEW

GENERAL INFORMATION - OTA - Occupational Training for Adults Program

One of the principal responsibilities of the Department of Manpower & Immigration is to help people to develop marketable skills through training programs. The Federal Government does not itself provide this training but what it does is to make training financially possible by paying for training provided by Provincial and Municipal Authorities.

To these ends the Occupational Training for Adults Program (OTA) provides for

- (1) Purchase of training for people recommended by Manpower Counsellors.
- (2) Payment of allowance related to family circumstances and living costs.

The aim of Manpower Training is to prepare a person for placement in employment where he can make his most effective contribution to the National economy. It is based therefore on the needs of the individual in relation to the needs of the labour market. The program is very wide in scope and difficult to explain briefly. However in the next few weeks I will try to explain the program on a practical level as it would apply to Clients interested in this area.

Although the program is not restricted to instruction in Industrial or manual skills, in most cases the program is orientated to the 9 month course provided by our Provincial Trade Schools.

In the case that a person has not the educational requirement necessary to admit him to trade school, Canada Manpower will finance this person on a 9 month Basic Training for skilled Development Course, to upgrade him to the level required by the Trade School.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to receive the benefits of the OTA Program a worker must (1) Be over 18 years of age. (2) Be out of the regular school system for three years. (3) Posses the academic standing required for entrance by the Provincial School or training centre for the course to which he is applying.

BENEFITS

If a person is accepted for training under the OTA Program, (1) The cost of training is paid by the Dept. of Manpower & Immigration on behalf of the client. (2) Transportation to and from the training centre is provided. (3) Allowances are paid to the client while he is in training.

The Allowance Scale for Newfoundland is as follows:

There has been a chronic shortage of jobs in the Wabush - Labrador City area since the beginning of January. Although business in general is always expected to slow down for the first month of the year we have more people than ever coming to the area on speculation of finding work.

There are very few sub-contractors in the area and those that are here have no positions available at the present time. Also 1968 has proven that the community has grown to the extent that turnover in employment will never again be as high as the "growing years". We have now reached the levelling off point and in the future we expect a more stable employment picture in which most workers will be calling the Wabush - Labrador Area "home".

With the hiring cutbacks of some Companies and lack of Sub-Contractors in the area we anticipate that we will have little to offer workers till well after February.

- SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP -

1 oxtail
Water
1 onion
1 carrot
Herbs
Pepper and salt
1 tablespoonful flour

OXTAIL SOUP

METHOD:

Cut the oxtail at the joints, put it into a stew-pan with 1 quart of water, 1 onion, 1 carrot mixed herbs, salt and pepper; bring to the boil, then simmer gently for 4 or 5 hours. Strain and return it to the saucepan adding 1 tablespoonful of flour, mixed with cold water; stir to prevent burning, then put the meat back again in the soup, boil and serve.

Head of celery
4 good-sized onions
Salt and pepper
1 pint milk
2 ozs. flour
Piece of margarine

CELERY SOUP

METHOD:

Split celery into four, boil with onions, salt and pepper, in 6 pints of water and $\frac{1}{2}$ pint milk, fully 2 hrs. skimming from time to time. Pour through sieve, rubbing in a fair amount of vegetables. Return to pan with 2 oz. flour mixed with $\frac{1}{2}$ pint milk and margarine. Stir until it boils.

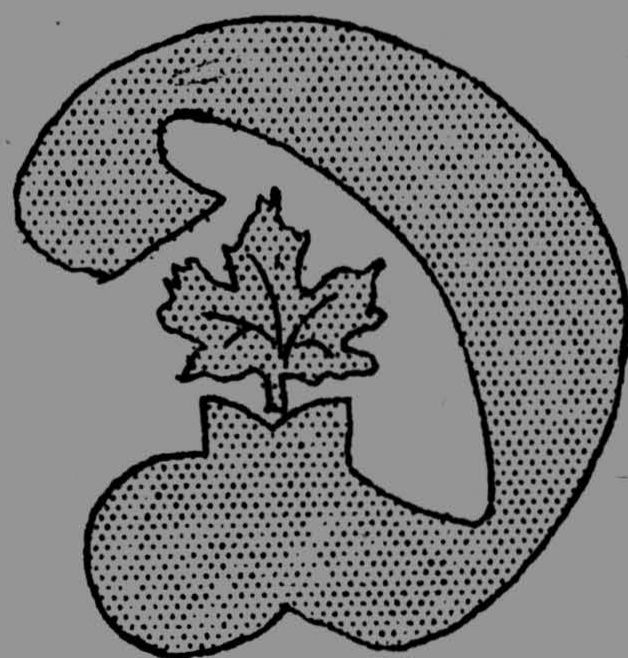
