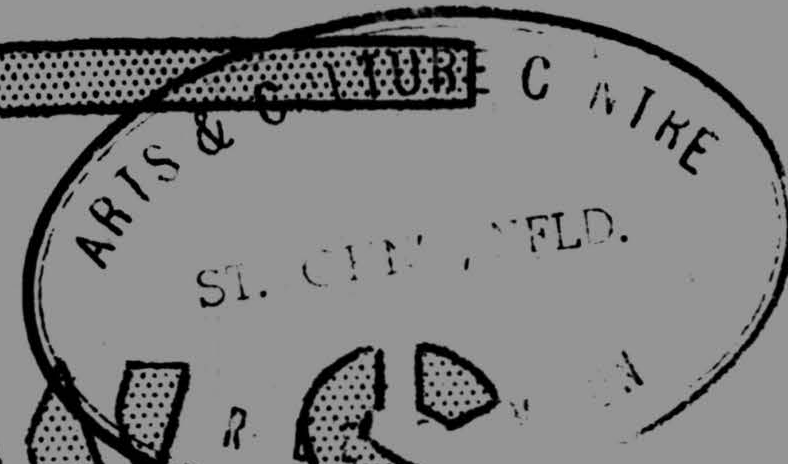
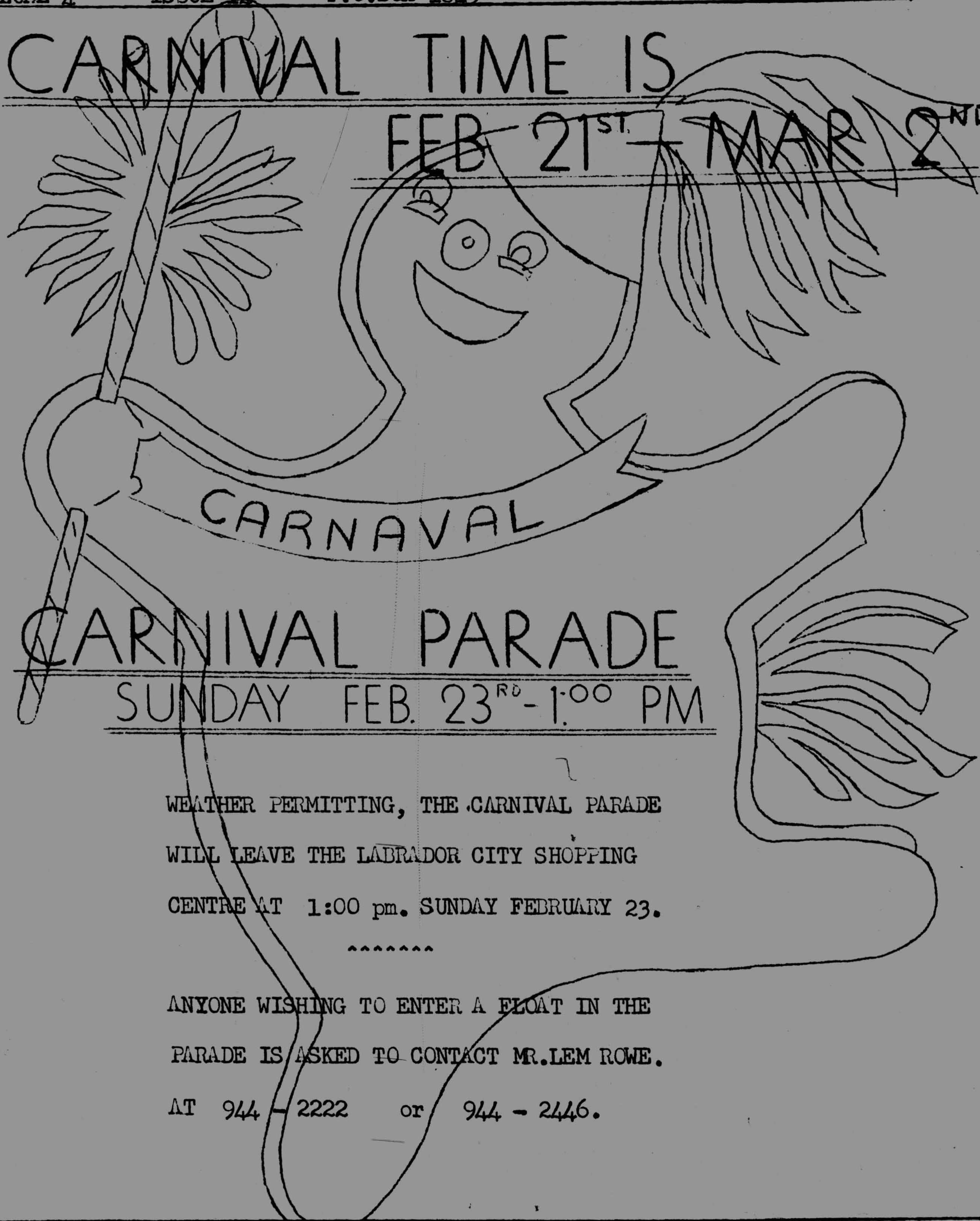

General Information.

BASIC TRAINING FOR SKILLED DEVELOPMENT

Basic education courses are special, intense or accelerated courses in designated educational subjects (usually Maths, English and Science) designed to upgrade a person to the academic level required by our trade schools.

There are two such schools in Newfoundland, one at Stephenville and the other at Bell Island, with a present enrollment of approximately 1000 students. There are also proposals for a new school in Happy Valley September '69 - in order to have upgrading more easily accessible to the people in Labrador.

The Provincial Government has made these schools available in an effort to provide the means for a person between grades six and ten to leave the Labour Force and prepare for training in a marketable skill. The Federal Department of Manpower provides the dollars to make such training financially possible to the worker.

Let us take the example of a labourer with grade six education who wishes to upgrade himself to a level where he could enter trade school. Mister X has three dependants to support and he cannot toy with the idea of going to school for any length of time. What can Canada Manpower do for this fellow?

Well, first we analyze the case and determine if this is a valid case for upgrading. If this is so, we instruct the client to apply to the nearest District Vocational Training Centre, explaining his background and asking for acceptance. Canada Manpower O.T.A. forms are then completed.

If the client is accepted to the training school and by Canada Manpower, we can guarantee his obtaining \$85.00 per week for the duration of the course. In this particular case the \$85.00 per week figure is based on three dependants and the student living away from his family. We also pay the transportation of the client to and from the school.

A Basic Training for skilled development course is nine months in duration. When a person enters the school he is given a certain number of tests to determine his approximate academic level. The fact that he may fall into a grade six, seven, or eight grade category has no bearing on his equivalent grade at the end of the course. A person who has been out of school for ten years and who is exceedingly bright might begin the course at a grade six level and end with an equivalent of grade ten or eleven.

As previously stated, these courses are intense or accelerated usually in Maths, English and Science and designed to determine an academic equivalent.

These equivalent grades given at the end of the course are acceptable to our Provincial trade schools. Each course offered at a trade school has a basic academic requirement and after the initial year of upgrading a student may apply for training in a skill demanding the equivalent he has attained. In his second year, at trade school, he is again eligible to receive the benefits of the Manpower O.T.A. Programme.

Thus a person with a previous education of grade six or lower has a chance of upgrading himself to a marketable level and be paid for it!

Fantastic? Not really. The Federal and Provincial Governments realised many years ago that a long range programme had to be developed that would work towards some sort of neutralization of rising unemployment and welfare costs. In a day and age that janitorial jobs require an academic level of grade ten, a concrete programme such as Occupational Training for adults offers the opportunity to anyone with a low academic background to bring himself to the level of employment demand.

Persons wishing information on how to enroll in a Basic Training for Skilled Development Course should contact us immediately.

Please keep in mind, as stated in last week's article - that to receive O.T.A. Benefits a person must be:

- (1) over eighteen years of age
- (2) have left the regular school system for three years.
- (3) be accepted by the Provincial Training Centre.

Transportation can be provided by Canada Manpower for a person who has left the regular school system for one full year, however O.T.A. allowances cannot be received. For persons not eligible for O.T.A. allowances, a provincial allowance of \$20.00 per week is provided.

- SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP -

BEEF MOULD

- 1. lb. cold roast beef
- 2 oz. bacon or ham
- 1 chopped onion
- approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ pint stock or gravy.
- 4 oz. breadcrumbs.
- Pepper
- 1 tablespoonful chopped parsley
- herbs
- 1 beaten egg.
- Salt.

METHOD

Mince the meat, and add to a pan in which the onion has been fried. Heat well, and add the stock, breadcrumbs, parsley, herbs, egg and seasoning. Butter a mould, sprinkle with breadcrumbs, pour in the mixture, cover with a greased paper, and bake for $\frac{3}{4}$ hour. Turn out and serve with a rich gravy poured round the mould.

PRESS RELEASE

Premier Smallwood has indicated that it is his definite intention to resign as leader of the Liberal Party this Fall. This being so I wish to announce that I shall seek the leadership of the Liberal Party at the Convention to be held later this year.

One of the factors which has influenced me to make this decision is that since the Premier's announcement I have been contacted by quite literally hundreds of persons urging me to run for the leadership. These persons belong not only to districts such as Grand Falls, or White Bay, or Labrador, or Lewisporte where, for obvious reasons, I am best known, but include persons in every district in the Province. Among them are miners, loggers, fishermen, teachers, business men, students, clergymen, and a substantial number of my colleagues in the House of Assembly and in the Cabinet. In fact, I understand that in some districts individuals and small groups have been quietly but actively promoting my cause.

It is well known that as a member of the Government I have served as Minister of Mines and Resources, of Public Welfare, of Education, of Highways, of Finance, of Community and Social Development, of Labrador Affairs and now of Education again. Thus I have been singularly fortunate in having been intimately associated with all of the tremendous developments which have revolutionized Newfoundland in the recent years. If the Liberal Party should decide to make me its leader this experience and background in public service would be both useful and valuable.

The Government, of which I have been a member, has striven to make Newfoundland a real part of the twentieth century. Great improvements have taken place but we are still behind. Now we are on the verge of a dramatic industrial and economic breakthrough, and as the leader of our Party I would have the opportunity to put into effect policies which would ensure a continuation and acceleration of our growth and progress.

In making this announcement to the people of Newfoundland I should like to stress these points. First, I want to assure all my constituents in the District of Grand Falls that while I shall campaign long, hard and vigorously, this will not be allowed to interfere with my duties as their Member. Second, I shall continue, as I have always done, to respect my responsibilities as one of Her Majesty's Ministers in the Government of Newfoundland. Third, in promoting my campaign I have no intention whatsoever of doing so at the expense of any of my colleagues whether they are in the leadership race or not. Finally, the fact that I am willing to offer my services for consideration is a clear indication that I have complete confidence in the future of our beloved Province.

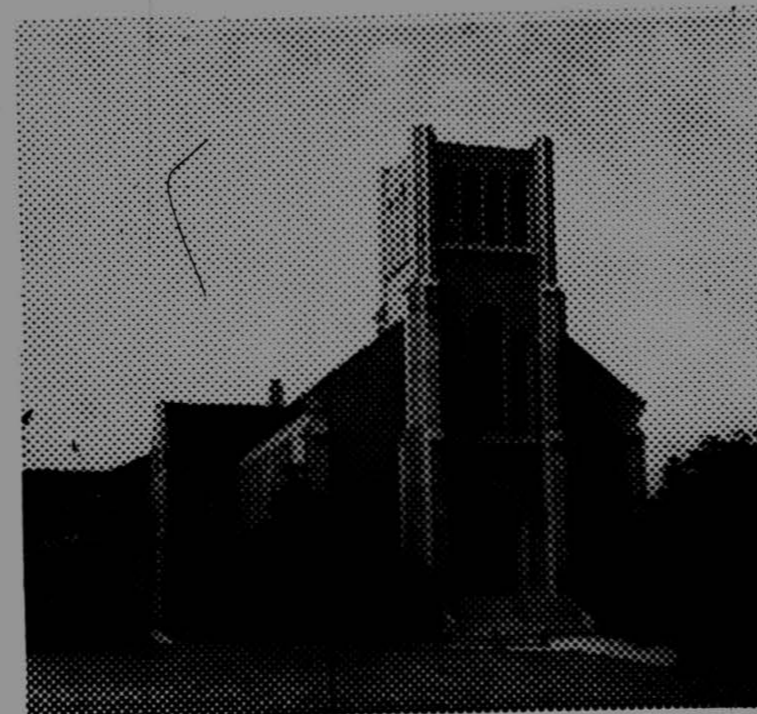

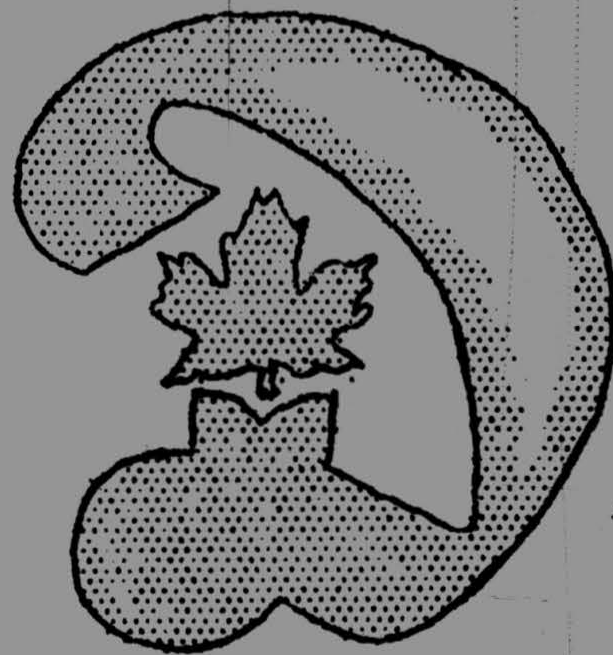

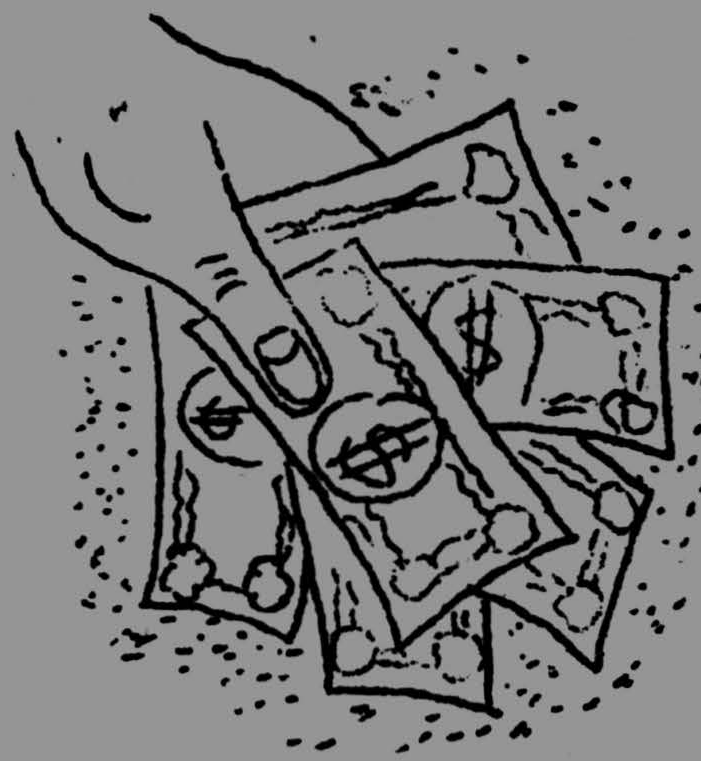
