THE LEGEND OF SAINT VALENTINE

The story of Valentines Day began in the third century with an oppressive Roman emperor, Claudius II and a humble Christian by the name of Valentinus.

Claudius had ordered all Romans to worship twelve gods, and he had made it a crime punishable by death to associate with Christians. But Valentinus was dedicated to the ideals of Christ, and not even the threat of death could keep him from practicing his beliefs. He was arrested and imprisoned.

During the last weeks of Valentinus's life a remarkable thing happened. Seeing that he was obviously a man of learning, the jailer asked whether his daughter, Julia, might come to Valentinus for lessons. Julia had been blind from birth, but she was very pretty and had a remarkably quick mind. Valentinus read stories of Rome's great history to her. He described the wonderful world of nature, taught her arithmetic, and told her about God. Through his eyes she saw the world, trusted in his wisdom and found comfort in his quiet strength.

"Does God really hear our prayers?" Julia asked Valentinus one day.

"Yes, my child, He hears every one," he replied.

"Do you know what I pray for every morning and every night? I pray that I may see. I want to see everything you have told me about!"

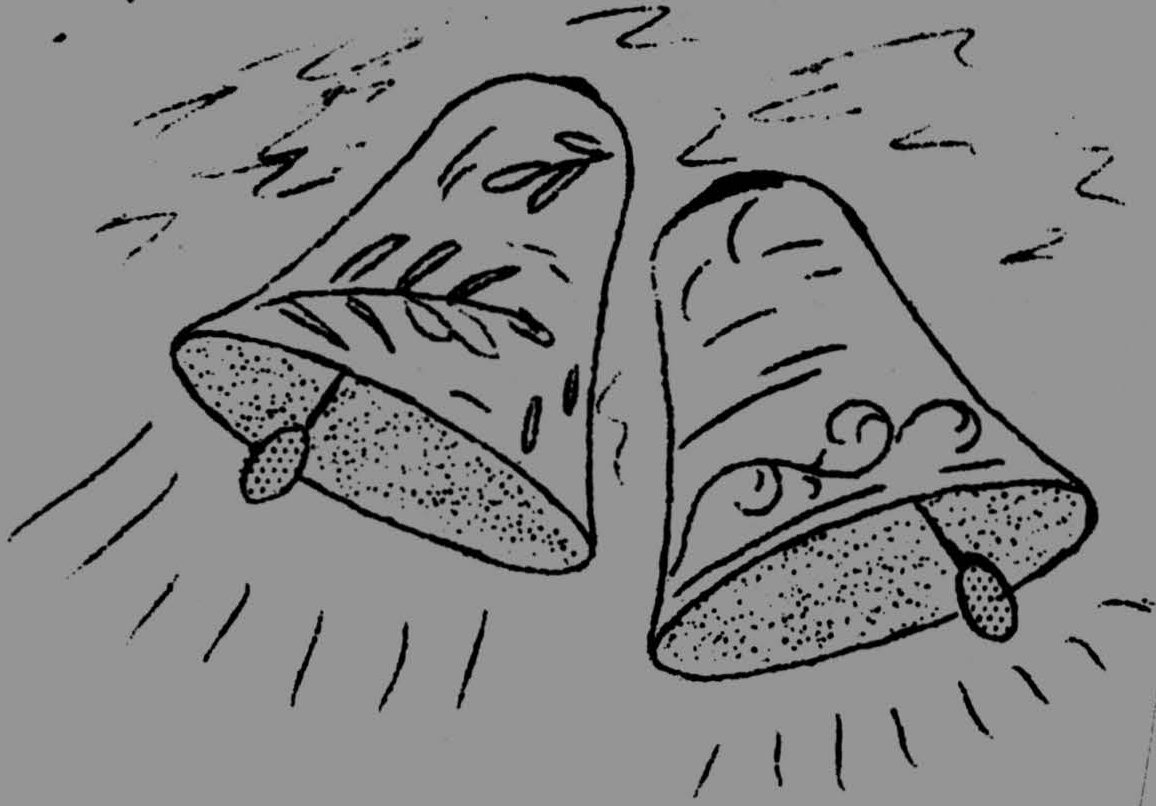
"God does what is best for us if we will only believe in Him," Valentinus said.

Julia grasped his hand. "Oh, Valentinus, I do believe."

As they sat quietly together praying, a brilliant light suddenly illuminated the prison cell. Radiant, Julia screamed, "Valentinus, I can see! I can see!"

On the eve of his death Valentinus wrote a last note to Julia, urging her to stay close to God, and he signed it "From Your Valentine." His sentence was carried out the next day, February 14, 270 A.D., near a gate that was later named Porta Valentini in his memory. He was buried at what is now the Church of Praxedes in Rome. It is said that Julia herself planted a pink-blossomed almond tree near his grave. Today, the almond tree remains a symbol of abiding love and friendship. On each February 14, St. Valentine's Day, messages of affection, love and devotion are exchanged around the world.
