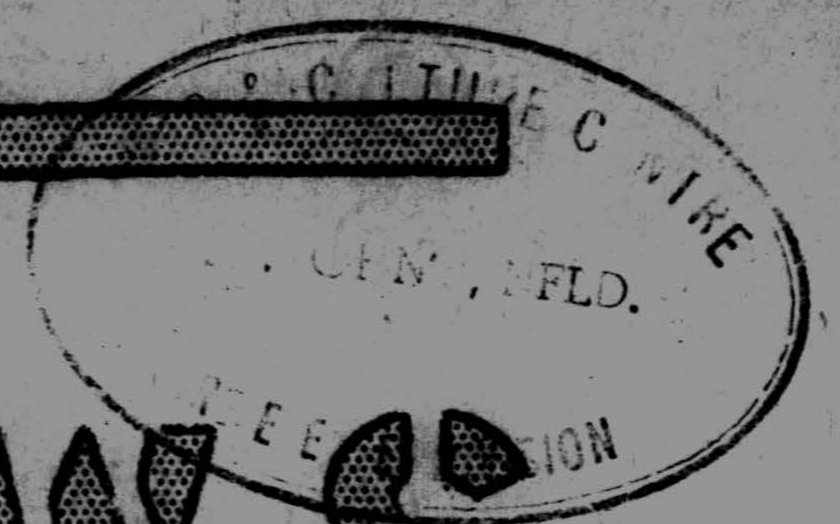

"Rejoice and Be Glad"

This coming weekend, February 21 to 25, will mark another milestone reached in the history of the Glad Tidings Tabernacle - Hudson drive. Affiliated with the Pentecostal Assemblies of Newfoundland, this congregation will participate in a mortgage burning ceremony, having completely cleared their debt on the Church in just under six years. For this occasion, Pastor A.S. Dursey, the General Superintendent of the Pentecostal Assemblies of Newfoundland will be the honoured guest and speaker all day on Sunday and at Services on the nights of the 21, 24, and 25th. At the head of this editorial are the words chosen to express the feelings of this Church at this time, in his Pastor's letter to the people, Pastor B.H. Hartwell added "for it is marvelous in our eyes what the Lord has done".

At our invitation, Pastor Hartwell has given this brief history of the Glad Tidings Tabernacle.

On May 8, 1960, the first Pentecostal Service was held in the Recreational Centre on the Town Site with five persons in attendance (these are residents of the town today, and all are employed by I.O.C.) Until May 9, 1963 several places were used for worship, including, the home of D.R. Parsons; Bechtel Building; Temporary School; Church Trailer; and McManus School. On May 9, 1963, a new Church was dedicated and officially opened, and present for this ceremony were Pastor A.S. Dursey, Pastor Roy D. King, Secretary/Treasurer of the Pentecostal Assemblies of Newfoundland, and Pastor Edwin King, Pastor of the Church. Representing the Iron Ore Co. of Canada was Dr. Moss, the mine manager; Mr. E.P. Murphy of the Anglican Church; Mr. P. V. Young from the United Church, and Capt. Gerrard of the Salvation Army.

The Church seats 110, but accomodation can be arranged for 160. An apartment beneath the Church provides a home for the Pastor. Besides the usual Sunday Services, Sunday School is held in the afternoon for all ages; a mid-week Prayer Service, Young Peoples' Service and by-weekly Women's Missionary Council are also held. Facilities include a Library, Nursery, and an outdoor loudspeaker system for the playing of Chimes, Gospel Music and Song. A console controlling the music also controls our indoor system. A Sower's Tract Club is active in the distribution of Tracts and Christian Literature to the Bunkhouses, homes and personal work. A paper entitled "HERE IS THE NEWS" is produced and written by the Pastor.

For the future, the Pastor and congegation look forward to serving the communities with a Full Gospel ministry and Evangelical message, reaching forther milestones

for the GLORY OF GOD.

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT & KEEP
- LANCASHIRE PARKIN -

INGREDIENTS

6 onz fine oatmeal
 6 onz wholemeal flour
 2 tsps. ginger
 2 tsps. cinnamon
 2 tsps. cream of tartar
 2 tsps. spice
 1 level tsp. bicarbonate of soda
 4 onz. fat
 3 onz. brown sugar
 3/4 teacupful of syrup
 beaten egg.

METHOD

Mix together the dry ingredients and rub in the fat until it is like fine bread-crumbs. Warm the sugar and syrup and stir in the dry ingredients, add the egg and mix well. Bake in a well-greased tin at 300° F for approximately 1-1 1/4 hrs.

Goose Bay Labrador

Goose Bay, originally carved out of northern wilderness to meet the strategic air defense needs of the USAF and the RCAF, is quickly changing its appearance and the tempo of its activities to meet the challenge of its designation as the "Gateway to Labrador."

In the span of a few short years the Town of Happy Valley, civilian companion to the Goose Bay military complex, has mushroomed into a progressive community where the industriousness of its citizens is being matched by industrialization of the area.

A pulp wood chip mill, now in the planning stage, will shortly provide year-round jobs for residents of the Goose Bay and Happy Valley area, while providing as well the raw materials for an expanded industrial base for the Newfoundland economy.

It is from Goose Bay that the Trans-Labrador Highway, a highway system to link the communities of Labrador together, will begin. And it is along this modern highway, with Goose Bay as the main terminal, that trade and commerce will soon flourish, and that opening of the Labrador treasure chest of mineral wealth will be made possible.

During the 25 years of EPA's existence as regional carrier to the Canadian Atlantic Area, it has served the aerial needs—both bushline and mainline—of the Goose Bay region, and it is with a measure of eagerness matching that of Goose Bay area residents that EPA anticipates the progress that will mark Goose Bay's future.
