Our thanks go to Mrs W. Muenzel of Caribou Crescent, Labrador City for the following Guest Editorial. Mrs. Muenzel was one of the organizers of the German Carnival Ball held at the Smokey Mountain Ski Lodge on March 1st. She explains to us exactly what 'Carnival' means in her native Germany.



For the first time last year, a group of Germans tried to bring to life in the Labrador City - Wabush area, the traditional way of celebrating Carnival just as it is done in the "old country". Carnival in Germany means lots of music and dancing, not only at the various balls but in the streets as well. Many songs are written especially for this gay time and once the singing starts it continues day and night, indoors and out and always accompanied by "schunkeln". To do this everyone sits down at a long, long table and, taking his neighbour's arm in his own - sways right and left to the rhythm of the music. Depending on the lateness of the hour and the consumption of wine, "schunkeln" is done while sitting, standing up, standing on the table or even on the chairs, but nobody can really appreciate "schunkeln" until they have tried it for themselves.

Trying to picture Carnival in the "old country" one must imagine the almost unbelievable variety of costumes worn. There may be horses, angels, devils, someone dressed up in a beer barrel, a dog may wear clothes just like those of his master, but whatever the masquerade - nobody looks or acts normal!

"Come all you fools and be yourselves!" is the motto of the German Carnival, and at the ball on March 1st everyone present obeyed. The lodge was decorated with mannequins hanging from the ceiling and walls, dressed in funny or old-fashioned garments. Cloths-lines were strung across the room displaying various items of clothing - all designed to raise at least a smile. Paper decorations and balloons were everywhere, not to mention a few artistically designed posters. The tables were elegantly set with white tablecloths, complete with candle.

Since masquerade was compulsory, everyone present was dressed in some kind of costume. There were hippies, monks, indians, clowns, tramps, sailors, ethnic costumes, including some from the 17 century. Not even the Bavarian Umpa Band excluded itself from the masquerade. Being a German band they wore the traditional "Lederhosen". At the first sound of their rousing music, everyone headed for the dance floor, which was crowded throughout the entire night.

During the evening, a supper consisting of big "Knackwürste", potato salad, rolls and hot mustard, was served. Baskets filled with delicatessen, wine and fruit, a bottle of champagne, a huge salami and a box of Swiss chocolates were awarded to the winners of the masquerade.

Unusual things happen during Carnival and, during all the gaiety one of the organizers assisted by a friend, quietly left, made his way down to the Queen's Ball and actually 'stole' the Carnival Queen. She proved to be a very good sport and was brought back to the Ski Lodge where an enthusiastic reception awaited her.

Everyone had a great time, if the high spirits and the late hour at which the ball ended are anything to go by, and we are already anticipating the next German Carnival Ball. I would like to say on behalf of the organizers, thank you for your support and SEE YOU ALL AGAIN NEXT YEAR !!!

This week, I had the unpleasant and heartbreaking experience of watching a four and a half month old puppy die of the dreaded and almost always fatal disease called distemper. Through no fault of the owner, the pup didn't receive the vaccination against this disease at the age of nine weeks, and when it could have been administered - it was already too late! Fortunately we were able to drug the dog to prevent any pain, and although every known drug was administered - it was all in vain and the dog died peacefully in it's sleep.

I cannot stress enough how vitally important it is for all dog and cat owners to see to it that this vaccination is given to their pets. If you really care for and love your pet, don't let it die for the sake of a few dollars! It is not a pleasant sight watching a dog die in convulsions or bleeding to death.

Within the next two weeks, I hope to receive some vaccine against distemper and infectious hepatitis, therefore, anyone wishing to have their pet vaccinated can do so by phoning me at 944 / 5101.

I would like to personally thank Dr. Pellerine of Sherbrooke, Quebec for sending medication and advice in an attempt to save this puppy's life, also Mr. Manstan, our druggist for his kind assistance, Miss Copp who administered the injections, Mr. Steve Szmtni - a special thankyou for all his kindness, and to everyone involved in this case goes our deepest gratitude.

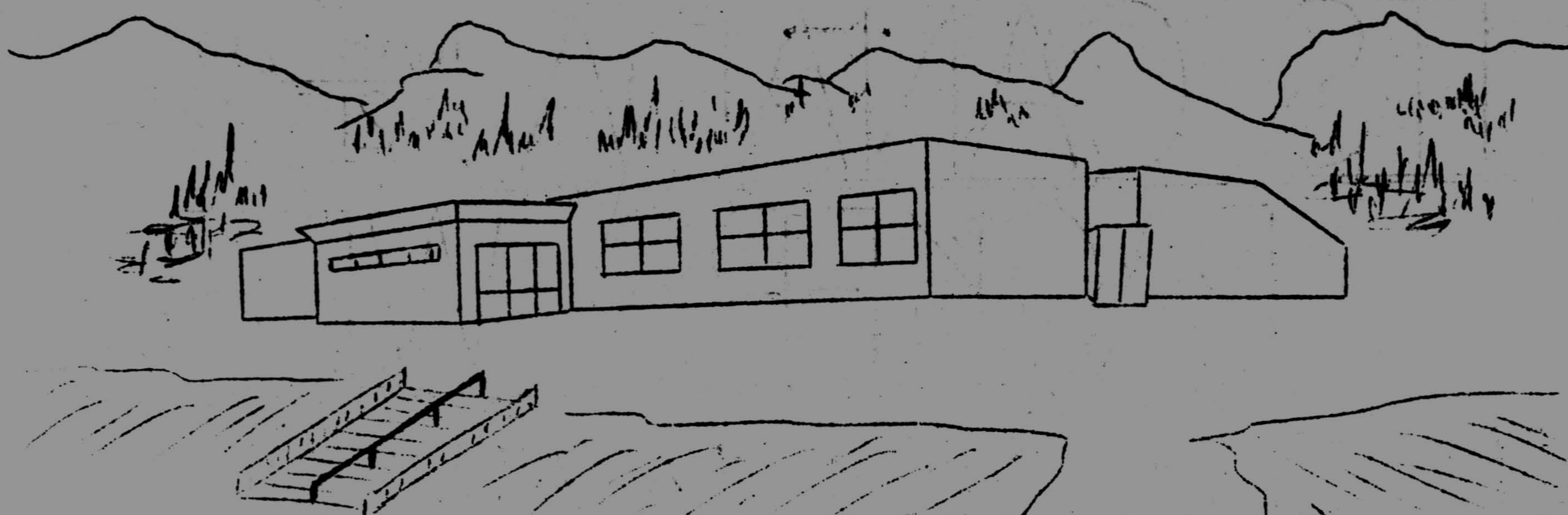

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT & KEEP

GINGERBREAD WAFFLES:

2 cups Five Roses Enriched Flour	$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. ginger
1 tsp. soda	$\frac{1}{3}$ cup shortening
1 tsp. salt	$\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar
$\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. nutmeg	1 cup molasses
$\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. cloves	1 egg unbeaten
$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. cinnamon	1 cup sour milk.

Sift together flour, soda, salt and spices. Cream shortening and sugar; gradually beld in molasses. Stir in $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of dry ingredients. Beat in egg, Alternately add remaining dry ingredients and milk. Bake in waffle iron at low heat. Makes 20 portions.

A MESSAGE FROM THE CANADIAN RED CROSS

What would happen to you if your home was destroyed by fire at 4:00 am. tomorrow morning and you and your family escaped in their night clothes?

Not a very pleasant thing to contemplate but it does happen and it did happen to seven hundred and twenty-seven individuals in Newfoundland during 1968.

Red Cross, which stands ready to assist on such occasions, spent \$19,703 on disaster relief in Newfoundland and Labrador during 1968. If you were not one of those involved in a disaster, you can consider yourself lucky. If you were, you will know how comforting it is to have a Red Cross worker call on you to offer assistance at such a distressing time. Their programme of making sure that no one suffers for the want of warm clothes to wear, blankets and other necessary items is always available to those in need of a helping hand.

A REVIEW OF "THE MISUNDERSTANDING" by A. Sumner.

"You could have heard a pin drop", a cliché perhaps but the best way I can think of to describe the tension that prevailed throughout the first performance of "The Misunderstanding", held on Friday evening in the Labrador City Collegiate.

I am not an experienced critic but like most people I know what I like, and to me this is probably the best play the Carol Players has given to date, and certainly the one demanding the most of its characters. Some of the speeches in the play were incredibly long and if there were any slips in dialogue at all, they were very cleverly concealed without the audience being any the wiser.

Dorothy Anne Matthews who played Martha gave a wonderful performance as the bitter, sarcastic daughter whose only tiny bit of human feeling at all was for her mother, played brilliantly by Jeannie Farr. These two ladies murder for profit, lonely travellers staying at their depressing little inn. The "misunderstanding" comes when they discover that the last victim was the son who had left twenty years before and who had returned incognito in the hope that his mother at least would recognize him. Larry Moss, whom everyone enjoyed so much in "See How They Run" gave an equally good performance as Jan, the son. Dianne Stokes the newest member of the Carol Players, made her 'debut' as Jan's wife Marie. This by the way was Dianne's first appearance before an audience and from her performance it won't be her last! The old man who haunted the play from beginning to end without uttering a word until the closing scene, was played by the director, Tony Duarte.
