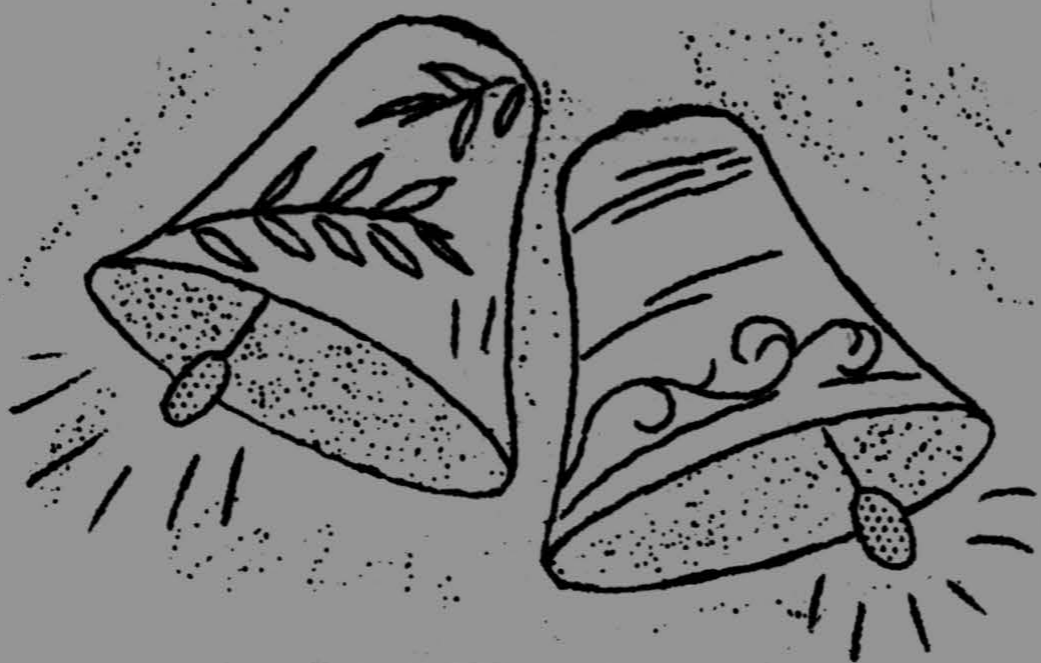

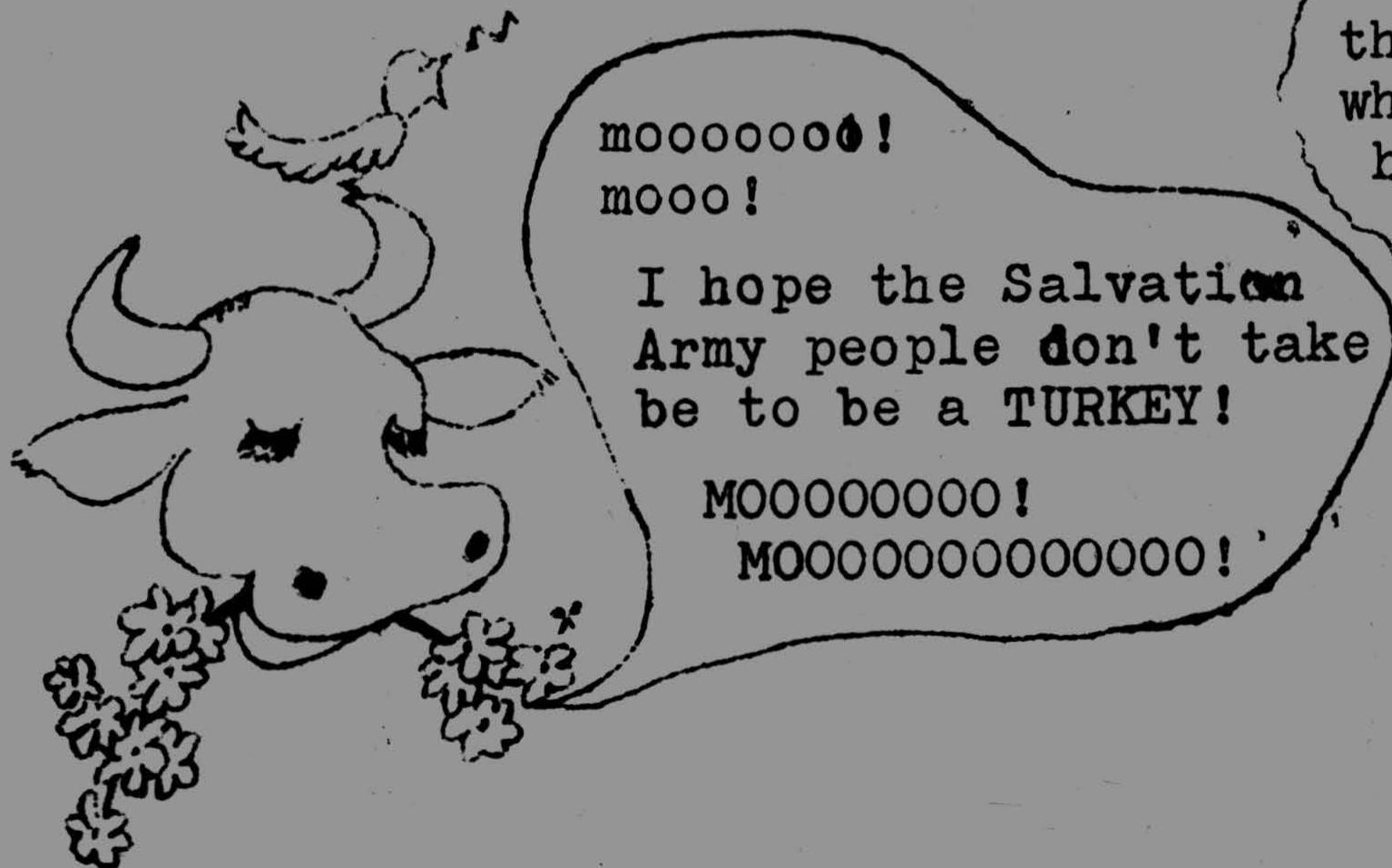

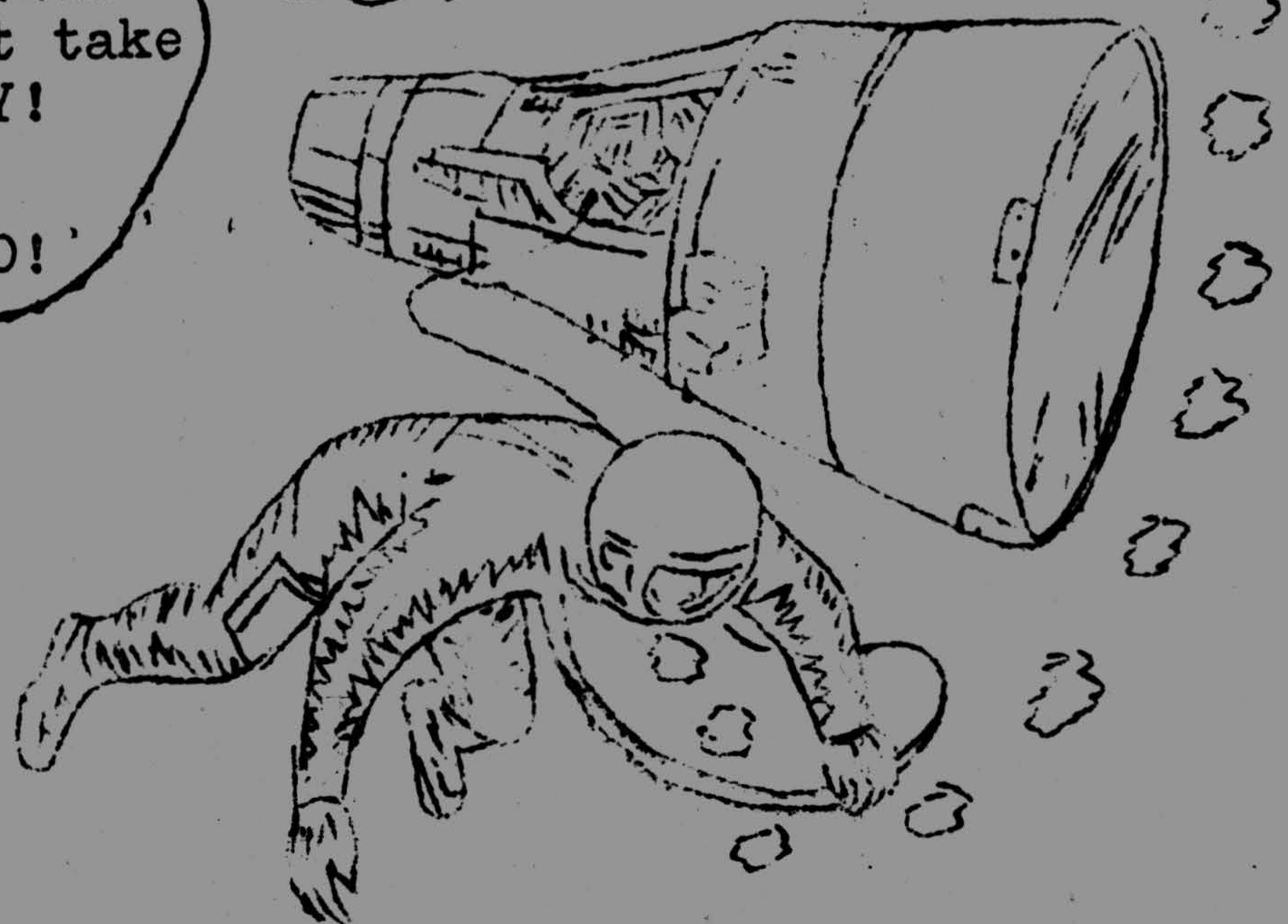

INTELLIGENCE AMONG ANIMALS

It seems that the monkey family is among the most intelligent of all animals. Some years ago a group of experts set themselves up to study the behavior of animals. By the way, one thing they found was that the chimpanzee was so clever that if he thought the test was too simple, he got bored and wouldn't play!

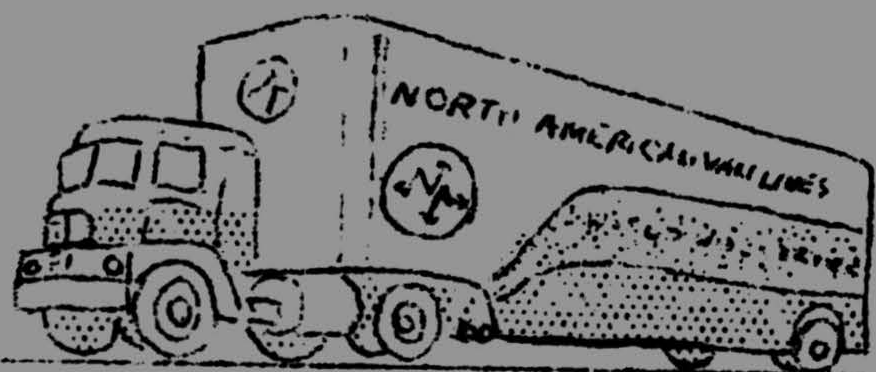

THE AMBLYOPIA CLINIC FOR PRE-SCHOOL CHILDREN WILL BE CONTINUED AT THE HOSPITAL IN LABRADOR CITY ON MAY 1st & 15th., AND IN THE RECREATION CENTRE, WABUSH, MAY 8th & 22nd:

PRELIMINARY TESTING WILL BE CARRIED OUT BY THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE, MRS JEAN WRIGHT. SHE WILL REFER ANY CHILD NEEDING FURTHER ATTENTION TO THE VISITING EYE SPECIALIST, IN JUNE.

PARENTS OF CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 3½ ARE REMINDED THAT IT IS PLANNED TO CONTINUE THIS CLINIC THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. HOWEVER, IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO LEAVE A CHILD'S NAME AT THE HOSPITAL UNTIL HE OR SHE REACHES THE APPROPRIATE TESTING AGE OF 3½ YEARS.

///// WEIGHTS AND VOLUMES /////

A few weeks ago - well, two months would be more exact, I received a letter from one of our readers asking me for a chart of weights and volumes so that she could try out the English recipes I have included from time to time in the Carol News. This comparison of English and American weights and measures is the best I could find and is worth cutting out and keeping.

COMPARISON OF ENGLISH AND AMERICAN WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

When English weights and measures are used - 3 teaspoons equal 1 tablespoon. The average English teacup is ¼ pint or 1 gill. The average English breakfast cup is ½ pint or 2 gills.

When cups are mentioned they refer to B.S.I. measuring cup which holds ½ pint or 10 fluid ounces. The BSI standard tablespoon measures 1 fluid ounce.

LIQUID MEASURE:

The American and Canadian pint is 16 fluid ounces, as opposed to the British Imperial pint, which is 20 fluid ounces. The American ½-pint measuring cup is therefore equivalent to two-fifths of a British pint.

SERVICE CLUBS GET BEHIND DRIVE TO ELIMINATE DEBT ON SERVICE CENTRES
FOR THE BLIND

Mr. Ronald Mercer, Chairman of the CNIB Special Projects Committee announced today that response to the request for this special assistance has been very gratifying. A committee comprises of representatives from Service Clubs in St. John's was set up recently and is now working out plans to raise the necessary funds. Interest in this project is high and several organizations have already made commitments to contribute substantial amounts.

It is hoped to interest organizations from all over the Province to contribute to this project, so that the present debt owing on the CNIB Centres at St. John's and Corner Brook can be liquidated. The present debt is in excess of \$95,000.00.

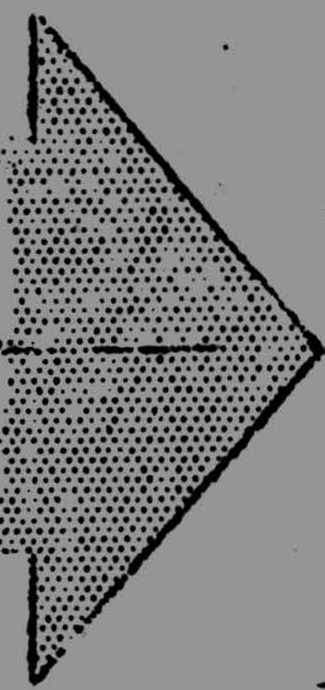
