HIS EXCELLENCY, Mgr. LIONEL SCHEFFER, O. M. I.

Lionel Scheffer was born on Feb. 24, 1903 at Ste. Marguerite of Masson Lake, Quebec. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1931 and received Episcopal Consecration April 28, 1946. From 1946 to 1966 he was Apostolic Vicar of Labrador.

With the support of his family, of the congregation of the Oblate Missionaries, of his numerous friends and benefactors Mgr. Scheffer, O. M. I. could answer the urgent needs of his vast territory. With zeal and ability he founded several parishes for the ever growing population of the mining regions of New Quebec and Labrador and to the advantage of the Lower North Coast. To him we owe the realization of the extraordinary religious, economic and social progress.

In appreciation of the many services rendered to the population of his diocese the Provincial Government of Quebec gave in honour of his excellency the name of Schefferville, the first town founded in the mining region of Knob Lake.

Mgr. Scheffer took special care of the missionaries with the Indians and Eskimos. With kindness and tact he brought attention to all their wishes for towards all the fathers, the brothers, and his numerous callaborators, he had a real and profound admiration.

In the death of His Excellency Mgr. Lionel Scheffer O. M. I. Apostolic Vicar of Labrador on Oct. 3, 1966 the Canadian Church lost an eminent missionary. It is with deepest admiration and gratitude that we dedicate this, our 1967 edition of the Collegiate to his memory.

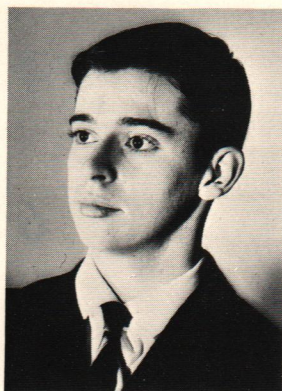

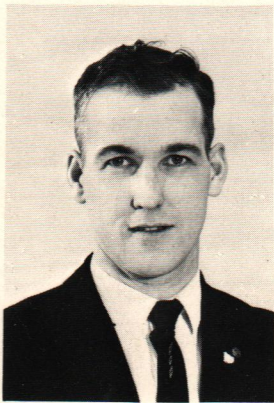

I would also like to congratulate those students graduating to higher grades, especially those who will have reached the end of their stay with us and I wish them every success in the vocation of their choice.

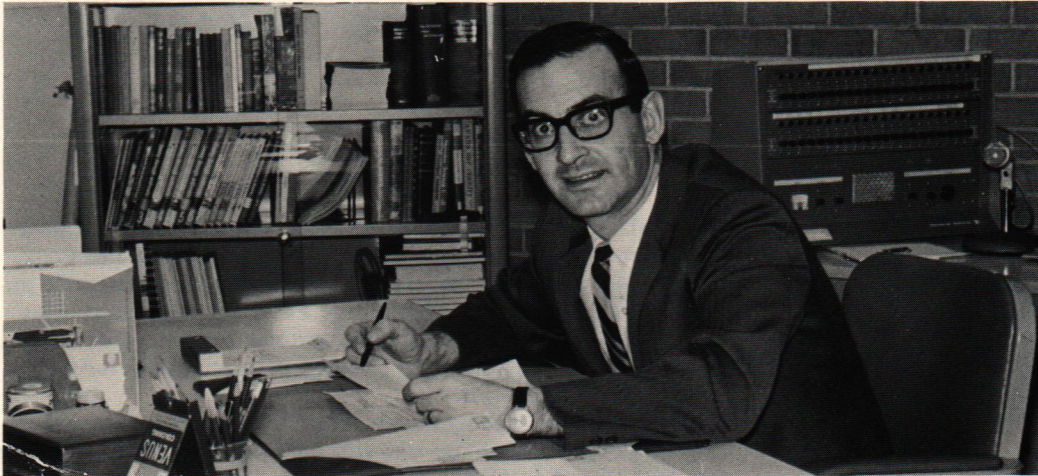

I am happy to be associated with the production of this Year Book.

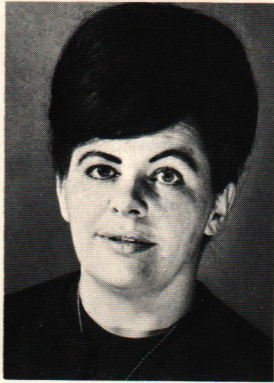
