Mr. William Kennedy, the Guidance Counselor, was very pleased with the response given by the various businesses of the community.



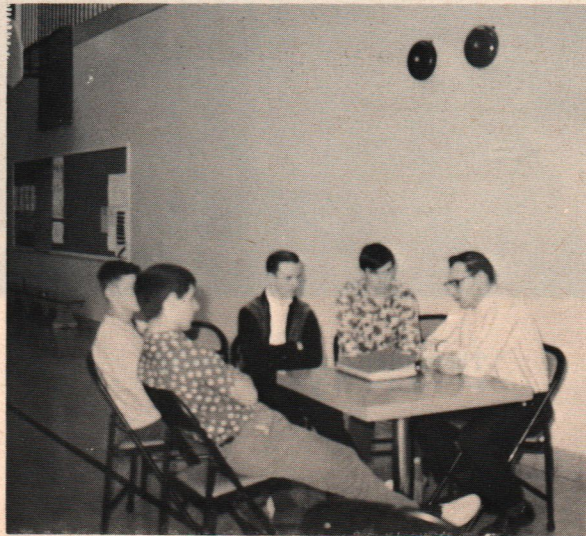

Tom Boone and Bob Besner (not again) accept the trophy for debating. This is the second year in succession that we have won it. This trophy was donated by C. B. C.



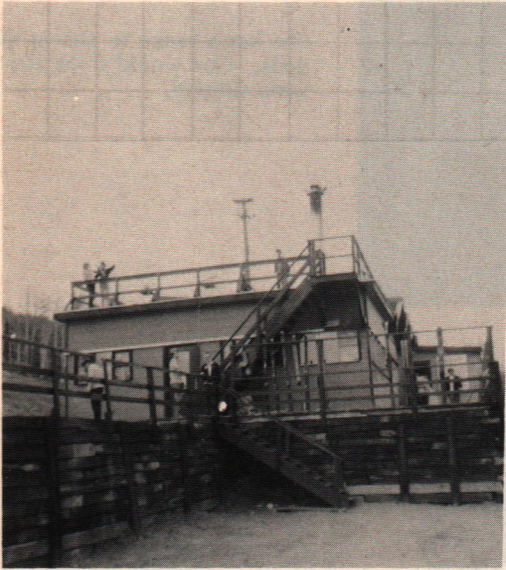

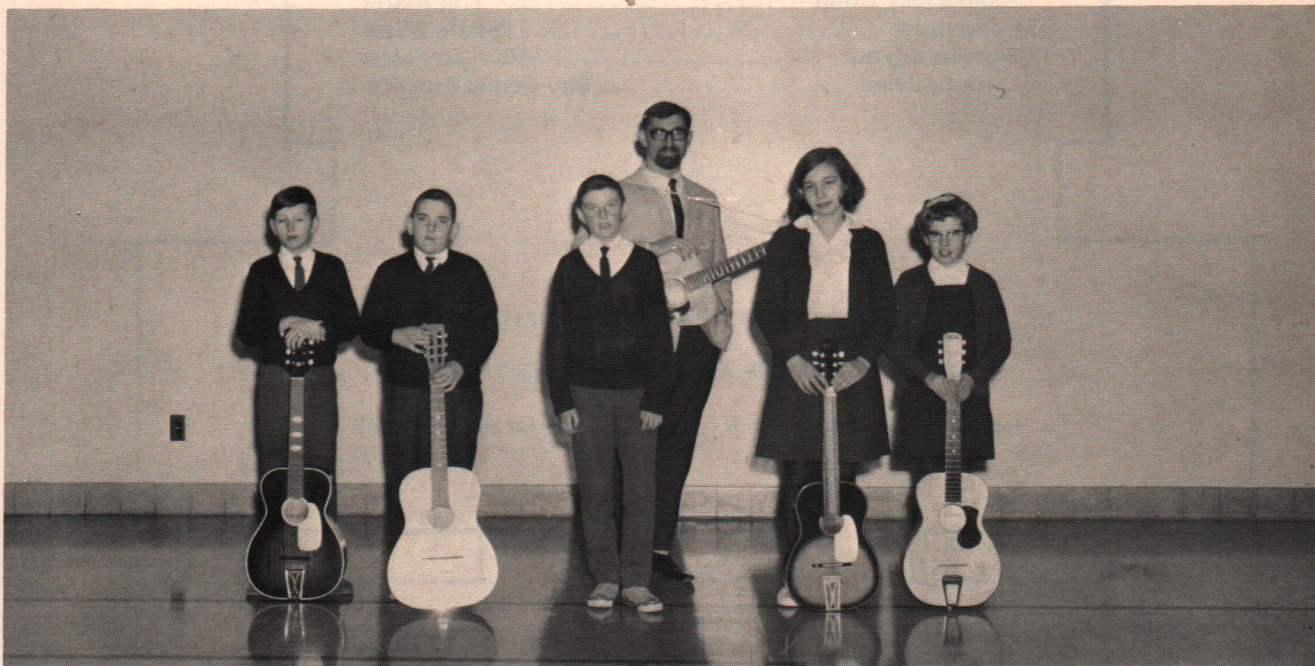
