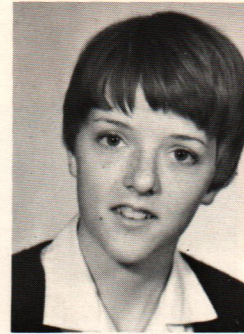


"Never do today what you can put off till tomorrow"

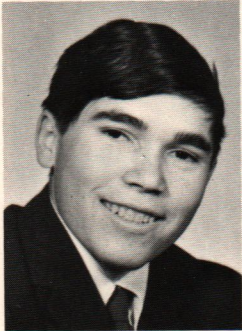
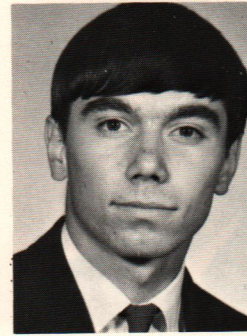


"Fellow students, friends, lend me your French homework"

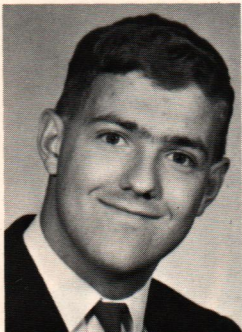
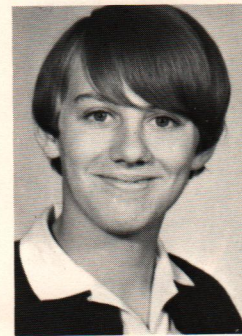


"A brain of feathers and a heart of lead"

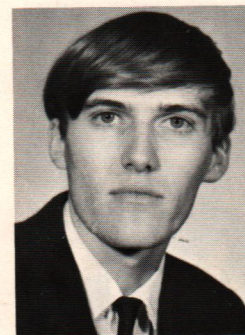


"Quantity but not Quality"

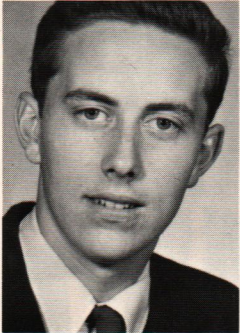
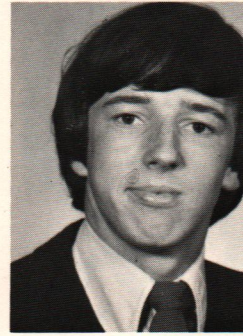
"To sleep, to die; to sleep! Perchance to dream"

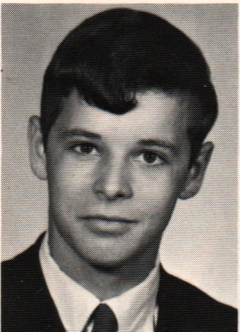


"Oh principal, my principal, our fearful school days are over"

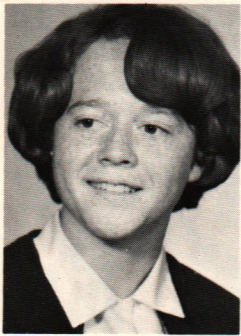
"He likes school days, but his weekends are better"

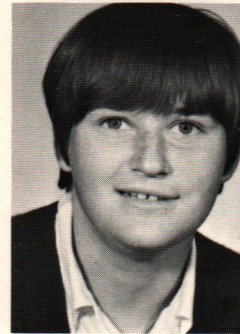

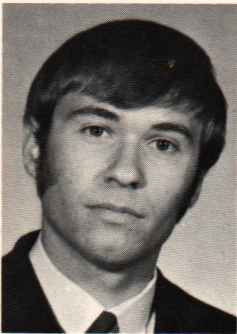
"She is little, she is wise, She 's a terror for her size".

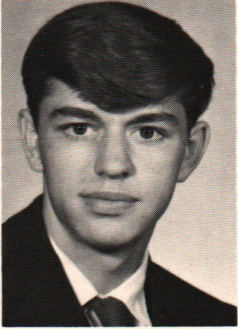
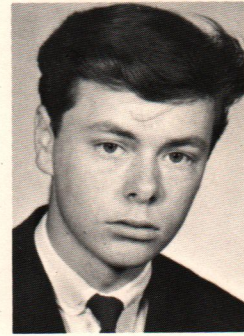


"The devil hath power to assume a pleasant shape."

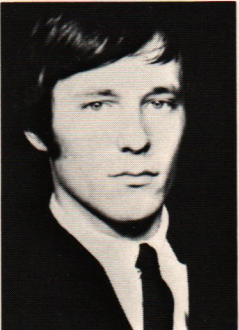
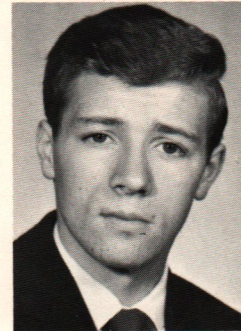


"Hears all, sees all, says nothing"

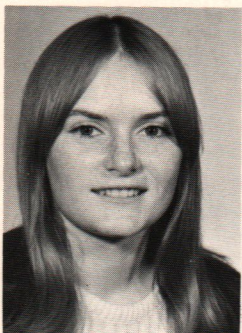
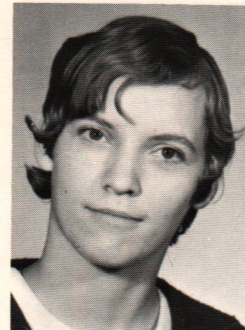


"I am a part that all I have met"

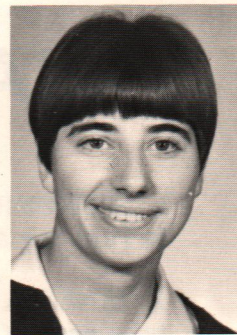


"Any man who turn's out light stand in darkness."

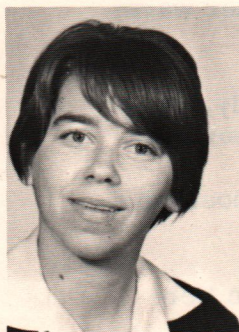


"She likes work, but she also likes a little nonsense too."

I, MICHEAL PERRY, being of weak body and weaker mind, do hereby leave Grade XI. . . . What a relief!!!

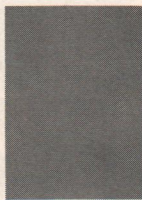
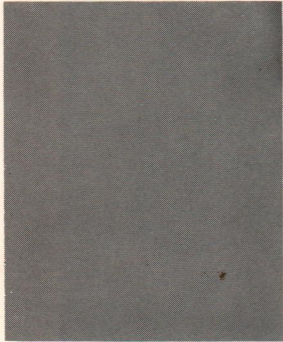
