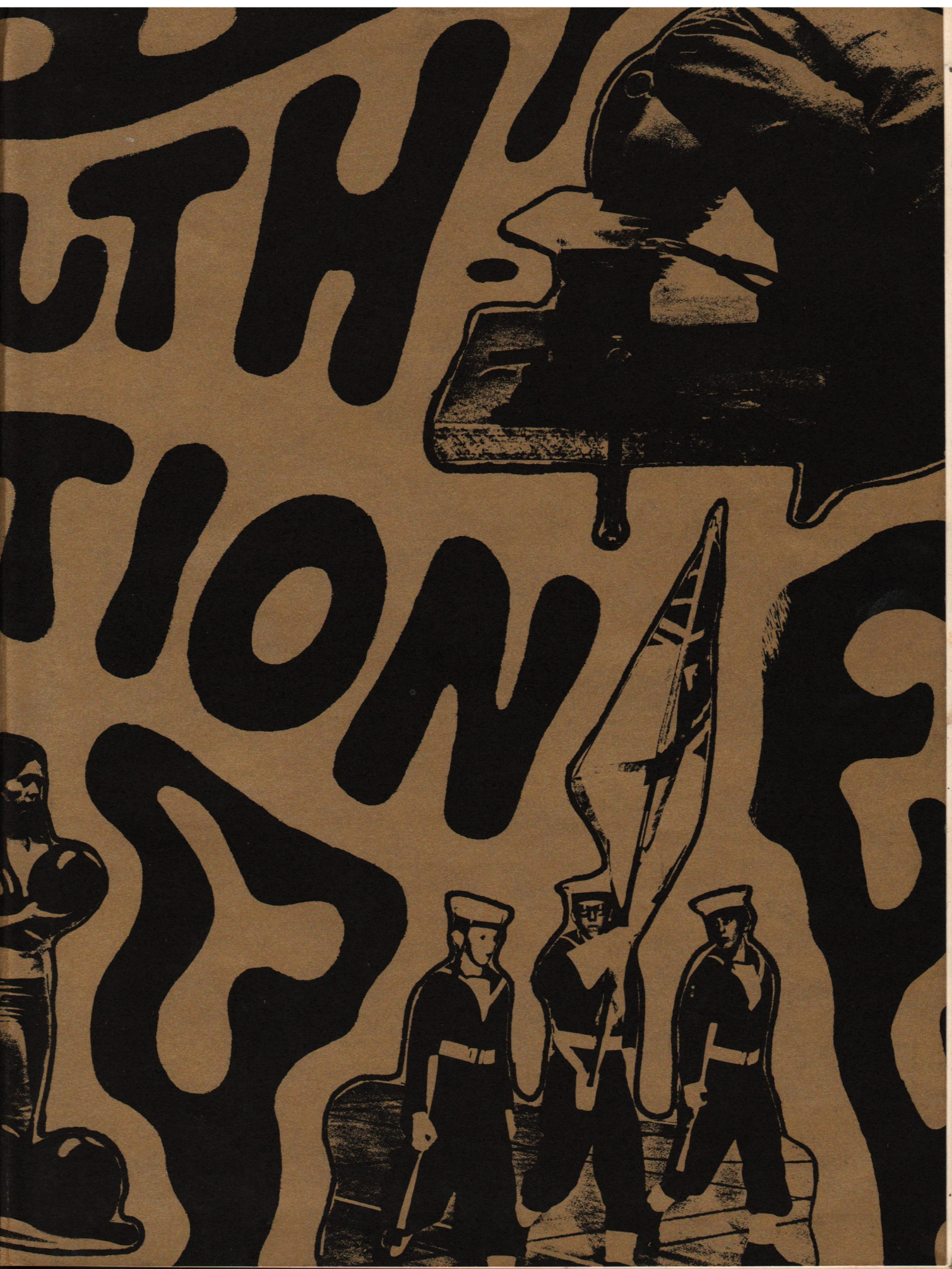

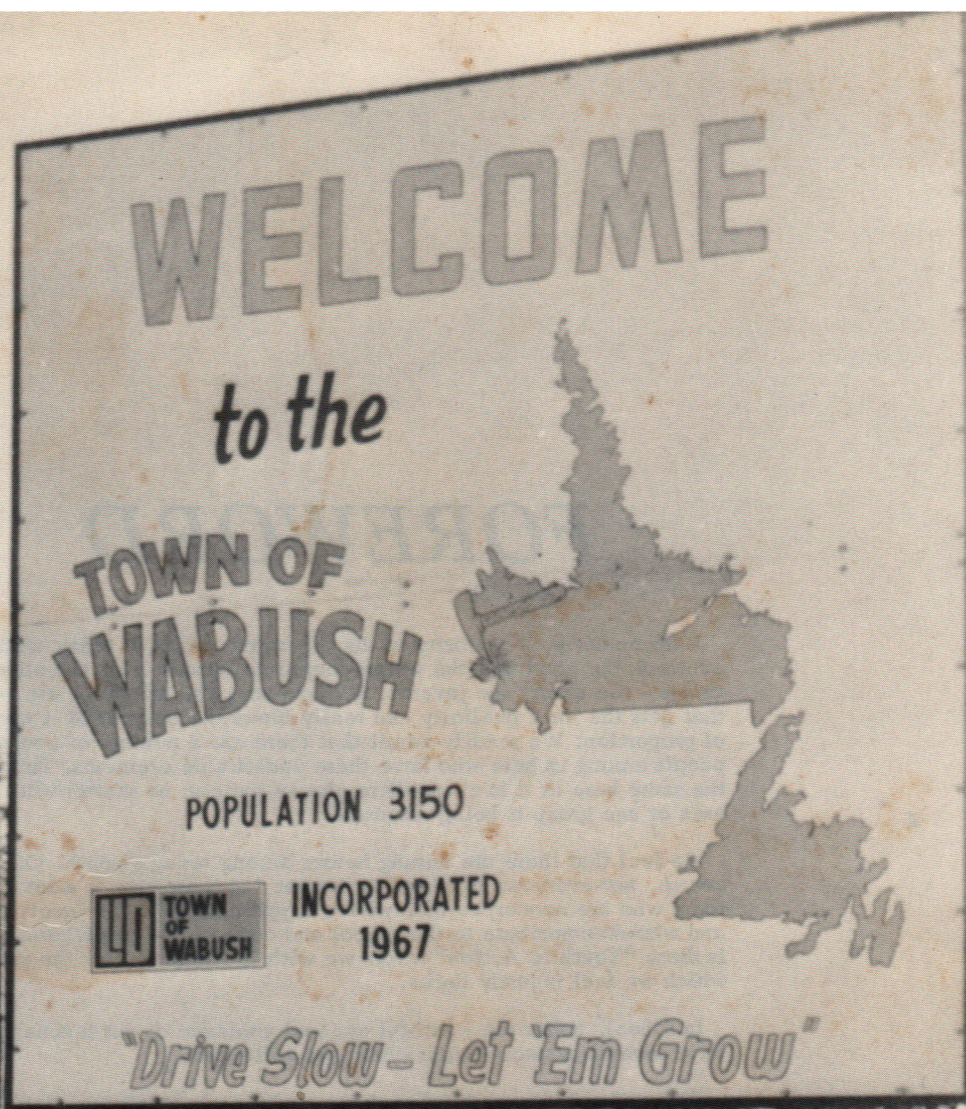
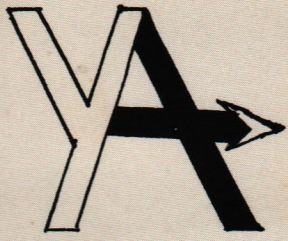

Our "Keepers of the Peace" help maintain discipline throughout the school. They are given the responsibility of being prefects and thus they learn the consequences in making decisions.

Plus, there are a number of other clubs - drama, photography, debating, public speaking, choirs, industrial arts, home economics, art, yearbook. From each of these the young people learn to be better citizens. They are given responsibility, the right to make their own decisions and therefore the chance to make our community a much better place in which to live.

Outside the school we have numerous clubs for youths of all ages. The three main ones being Sea Cadets, Scouts, and Guides which are run by our dedicated parents.

In Guides girls learn the basics of life - first aid, cooking, sewing, etc. The Scouts is an international organization for boys between 11 - 14 years where they learn how to look after themselves in the wild. Sea Cadets is a naval organization in which the boys learn how to be a good seaman. In each of these groups, the young people learn the qualities of a good citizen, how to make a better life for themselves and for the community.

During the summer there are sports for all. Just to keep the kids out of trouble? That may be one reason, but the main ones are to provide recreation and opportunity to "Burn off" energy.

So, we feel we're justified in dedicating our book to the worthwhile actions of youth. At the same time we would like to impress upon those who do not play their part - that they are missing out on the things which make life worthwhile. The sense of satisfaction which comes from helping others, the spirit of comradeship found in a group working together, and the pride of knowing you are a part of a job well done.
