I, DEB TAYLOR, leave my body to Mr. Roger Taylor, and my books to an empty outhouse in Newfoundland.

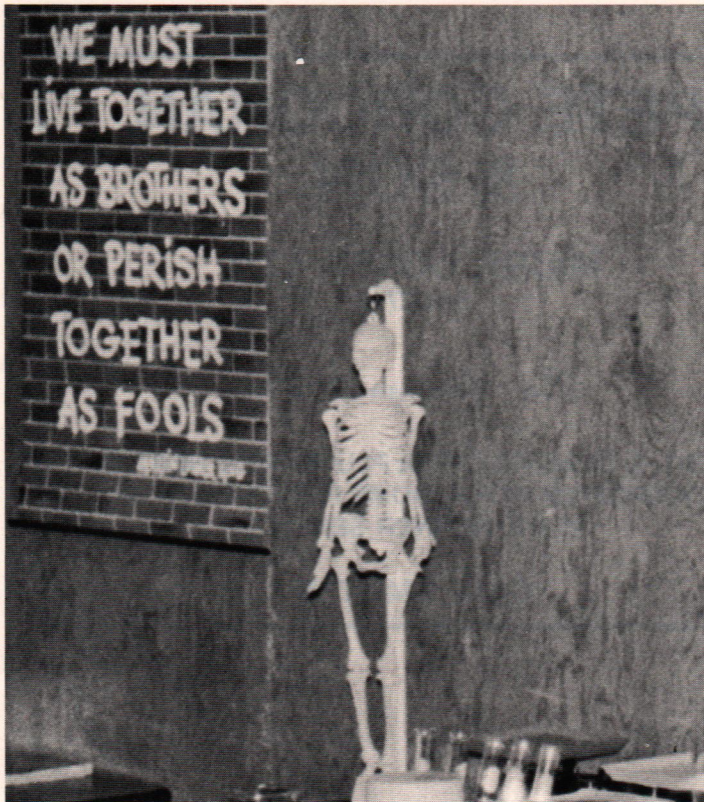
I, SCOTT TAYLOR, being of cracked mind and fractured body, leave my junior Electronics kit to Mr. Sheppard in the hope that he will learn something.

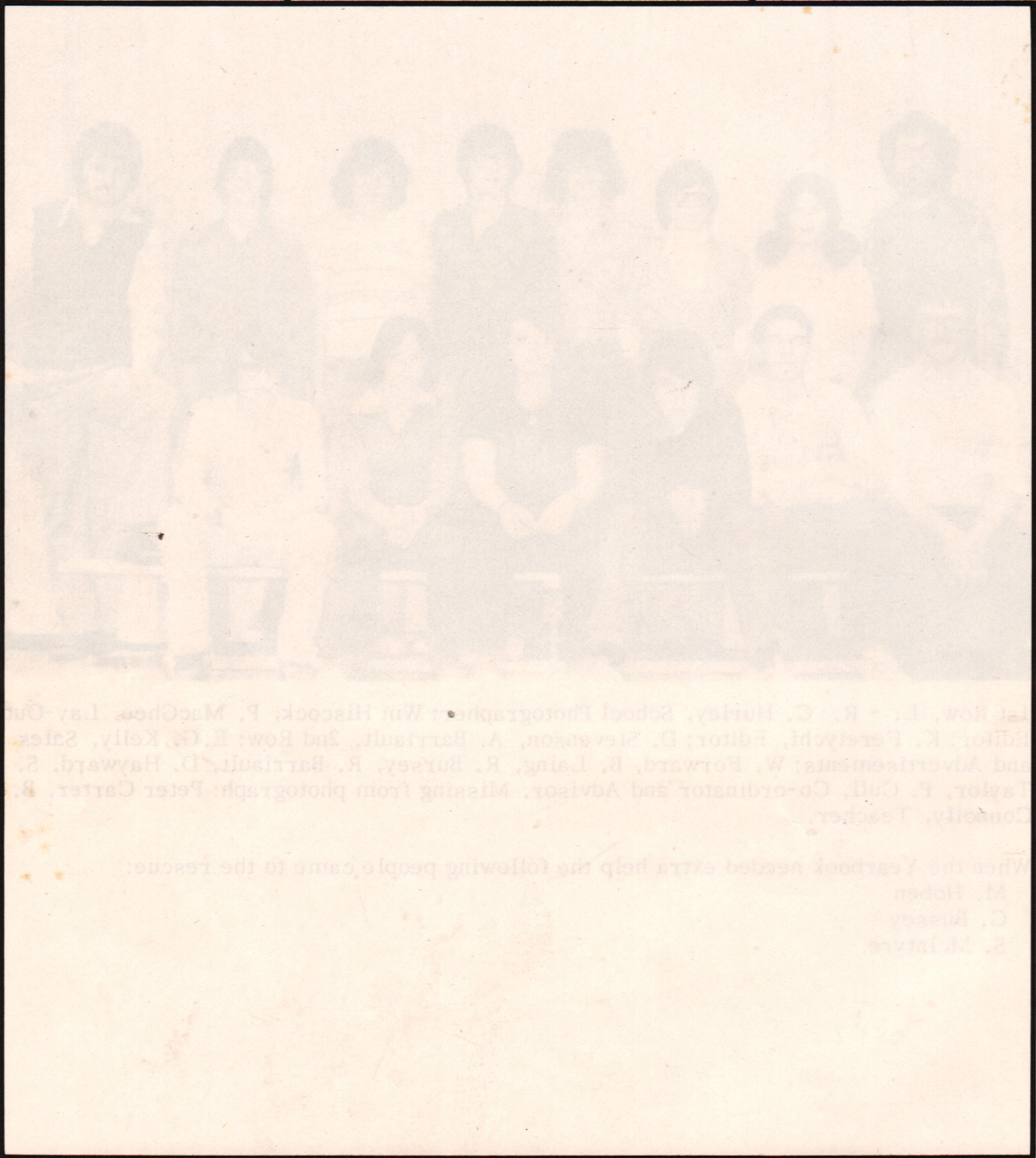
